IN TODAY'S GOSPEL

Today's reading is about our call to be astute, even canny disciples. The parable of the Dishonest Steward is difficult for us to understand because we are unfamiliar with the business practices of the time. Stewards worked to make the maximum profit for their masters. An accepted way of making more money for the master was the practice of charging clients a high interest rate for goods supplied but not yet paid for. But since charging high interest (usury) was against the law, it could not be shown as such in the accounts. Instead, it had to be disguised as extra goods supplied.



This steward had wasted his master's property and

not acted in his master's best interests. Faced with dismissal, he immediately set about currying favour with his master's clients in the hope that, remembering how he had saved them a great deal of money, they would later welcome him. He reduced their bills by removing the disguised high interest charge. He thereby deprived his master of the extra profit and, at the same time, put the clients in debt to him. His master, recognizing how shrewdly he had acted - even though it had been at his expense - praised the steward for his astuteness.

By telling his hearers this parable Jesus wanted them to draw the conclusion that they too should use their money shrewdly. However, the use of money in the kingdom of God is very different from in the world. In the world, money is tainted. It seduces and blinds. It has a way of enslaving us so that all our energies go into becoming richer, even at the expense of others. In the world the use of money is always for our material benefit and advantage.

In the kingdom of God, however, the shrewd use of money is for the furthering of the kingdom by doing good to others, especially the needy. This always brings blessing. When we share our possessions, which are on loan from God, with those in need, we are given the treasure of heaven as our own inalienable possession. It is through being generous and kind to others that we become astute disciples of Christ – for in doing this we store up treasure in heaven, where no thief can destroy or steal.

Lord, please show me how to be a good steward of the worldly and spiritual riches you have so kindly given me.

Feast Days ST. PADRE PIO

Padre Pio, also known as Saint Pio of Pietrelcina, was a friar, priest, and mystic, now venerated as a saint in the Catholic Church. Born Francesco Forgione, he was given the name of Pius when he joined the Order of Friars Minor Capuchin. OUR LADY OF WALSINGHAM

Our Lady of Walsingham is a title of the Blessed Virgin Mary venerated by Catholics and Anglicans associated with the Marian apparitions to Richeldis de Faverches, an English noblewoman, in 1061 in the village of Walsingham in Norfolk, England. Lady Richeldis had a structure built named "The Holy House" in Walsingham which later became a shrine and place of pilgrimage. In passing on his guardianship of the Holy House, Richeldis's son Geoffrey left instructions for the building of a priory in Walsingham. The priory passed into the care of the Canons Regular of St. Augustine, sometime between 1146 and 1174. Pope Pius XII granted a canonical coronation to the Catholic image via the papal nuncio, Bishop Gerald O'Hara, on 15 August 1954 with a gold crown funded by her female devotees, now venerated in the Basilica of Our Lady of Walsingham.

ST. VINCENT DE PAUL

Vincent de Paul CM was a French Catholic priest who dedicated himself to serving the poor. He is venerated as a saint in the Catholic Church and the Anglican Communion. He was canonized in 1737. He was renowned for his compassion, humility and generosity.



Maintenance Projects

We have a large number of major maintenance projects which we are unable to carry out due to lack of funds. Have you noticed, for example, a wall heater which needs replacing? The cost for this is £2,311.20. Also we have to replace all the windows and woodwork on the Sacristy and Parish Room, which can be seen from the playground. The cost for this is in excess of £5,000. These are just a few of the maintenance projects that need doing and must be undertaken soon to preserve our assets. Please consider all these items when you give to your church each week. All maintenance work and normal bills for heating, electricity, etc. has to come from our income as a parish. Please also keep in mind that £900.00 per month goes to our Diocese upkeep.
