

Welcome to our parish family and visitors to our celebration of the Pascal Mysteries.

We are now in the season of Lent. We are called to prayer, fasting and abstinence. It's an opportunity to put into practice the corporal works of mercy, namely: to feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, to clothe the naked, to visit the sick, to bury the dead and visit those in prison.

May I suggest that we put aside a "mercy jar". For example, if you give up a particular drink or cut out snacks. Then the money you would have spent on them, put it into the "mercy jar". Likewise make some kind of sacrifice, for instance give up buying some material item if you really don't need it. The money you would have spent, put it into "the mercy jar" and so on. Then at the end of Lent you can make a donation from the "mercy jar" to whatever charity you wish to give.

Pray together as a family especially the rosary. Maybe come to an extra Mass during the week. This task can become a great family way of "walking the way of the cross".

The season of Lent is such a season of grace through the sacrament of Reconciliation and doing good works of mercy.

## Journey Home - continued

Today Jesus teaches us about prayer. Once again, we need to recognize that he teaches essentially about the prayer of one who is baptisally united with Jesus. As such, we actually share in Jesus' own prayer to the Father. We can say, therefore, that the 'Our Father' stands as a sort of description of Jesus' own relationship with the Father. It is what Jesus lived by and reveals the confidence in the Father that Jesus lived. At its heart, the 'Our Father' expresses the daily desire of Jesus to carry out the Father's will. It is significant that Jesus encourages us not to 'heap up empty phrases' when we pray, because 'your Father knows what you need before you ask him'.
