



Journey Home Threshold of Hope (Continued)

The joy that the discovery of the kingdom brings involves a willingness to give up everything else for it. Jesus' emphasis is on the joy rather than on heroic self-sacrifice or surrender. There's great joy in finding the true treasure that is the kingdom. The question is, are we willing to pay the price? Sometimes, realizing the cost, we want and yet we don't want, we seek but we don't actually want to find, we're like people waiting at a bus stop, yet hoping that the bus won't come! In a way Christians are always seeking treasure, always finding new aspects of it, always searching. This search may lead us in many different ways, and we may know different ways, and we may know a real restlessness until we find our true home in God. As John Henry Newman said, 'To live is to change, and to be perfect is to have changed often.' And yet it's really God who is searching for us and seeking to bring us safely home.
