While he was still a long way off, his father saw him and was moved with pity. He ran to the boy, clasped him in his arms and kissed him tenderly.

IN TODAY'S GOSPEL

Jesus attracted those outside of conventional society; tax collectors and prostitutes clearly enjoyed his company, and were drawn by his acceptance of them. This made them open to hearing what he had to say. The Pharisees, in contrast, were scandalized by the company he kept, and they harshly judged those they saw as morally bankrupt or spiritually inferior.

Typically, Jesus seized the moment to teach about his Father, which is the essence of his mission. Our image of God is often tainted or distorted, and we can fall into two extremes: on one hand, we imagine God as a tyrannical judge who's constantly angry; on the other, we feel he's overindulgent and avuncular, and it's easy to pull the wool over his eyes. We may feel that God's teachings and commandments have little bearing on our lives. Jesus' parable brings us right into the heart of his Father. God has given each of us free will and we're at liberty to follow or reject him. However, this carries with it a profound responsibility, as we're accountable for our actions and decisions. The son in the parable exercised his freedom and chose to leave the safety of his father's house. At the dawn of creation, humankind also freely chose the path leading away from God. Removed from the love, security and protection of the Father's house, we lost our way. Sin, death and corruption robbed us of the dignity we once possessed. Like the prodigal son we became slaves of our passions and drives.

The image of the chastened son returning home is deeply moving. We'd do well to ponder and meditate upon this picture of profound human abjection encountering divine mercy. Jesus' teaching about our Father exposes us to a love so divine and compelling that it has the power to melt the hardest of hearts. As we journey through this Lent, we too can experience the warm embrace of our heavenly Father. Pope Francis writes in Evangelii gaudium:

'Lord, take me once more into your redeeming embrace'. How good it feels to come back to him whenever we are lost! Let me say this once more: 'God never tires of forgiving us: we are the ones who tire of seeking his mercy'.

We do encourage you to return to our parish family at one of the masses at the weekend if you are able. To come to our Sunday Eucharist and receive the Body Blood Soul and Divinity should be the high point of our lives. Here we have a personal encounter with the Crucified and Risen Lord. This meeting always takes place as part of the action of the whole Church including the angels, the martyrs and all the saints. To take our place amongst this great company and to receive

the graces of Holy Communion should involve some preparation in order that we can abandon ourselves more completely to the saving mysteries that we celebrate. In the Gospel parable there are three people : the elder son the younger son and the father. This story is called the parable of the 'prodigal son . It could be of the prodigal father or prodigal elder son. The father goes in search of the younger son who was lost and welcome him home . We can today reflect on the replies of the two sons to their father who went to meet them. The younger son feels he is not worthy to be a son because of spending all his money on sinful living. Where as the elder son says ' all there years I have slaved and never once disobeyed anything orders of yours ' The word of God invites us to look at ourselves- and see where we stand in Our Fathers presence at this moment. Luke's does not tell us whether the elder son went into the house to celebrate the coming home of the younger son? The story is a symbol of the kingdom of God - heaven. Would we be willing to share in the celebration thrown open by the Heavenly Father even if that meant that I find myself in the company of those who squandered their time in loose living.? *I wish you all a happy weekend and a safe week. May God bless our families.*

QR Codes

Giftaid-it

What are they and how do they work?

A QR (Quick Response) code works in the same way as a barcode at the supermarket. It is a machine-scannable image that can instantly be read using a Smartphone camera. Every QR code consists of a number of black squares and dots which represent certain pieces of information. In our instance, the QR code will take you directly to a website where you can make your donation digitally, instead of using cash. The Diocese is wanting ALL churches to use this form of giving to replace cash which is time consuming and expensive to count and check.

Using the QR code enables the parish to save time and money - both of which are very welcome! So please don't forget that if you normally donate cash weekly, then please use the QR codes which can be found on the back page of the newsletter each week. This helps to keep the money coming in while reducing the amount of cash that we have to count, double check and then take to the bank. And amazingly some banks have actually stopped taking cash!
