

# Friday Obligation

A reminder that as Catholics we are obliged not to eat meat on Fridays.



Welcome to all our parish family and visitors to our parish celebration of Our Holy Mass. Thursday of this week is the Feast of The Ascension of the Lord. It is a Holy Day of Obligation (i.e. we need to come to Mass on this day). This is a great feast, a solemnity. We should not underrate it. A cloud took the Lord out of sight. This feast is an integral part of our Redeemer's Pascal Mystery. and therefore a saving mystery for us all. It is an article of our Creed. "I am ascending to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God". It is precisely the God-Ward, Farther-Ward element of Christ's life, death and resurrection that is made so clear today, being symbolic by his lifting up

and disappearing from human sight. We are shown the new life brought by the Risen Lord. It is a return to God-eternal life - the life of the world to come. Left to its own natural powers, humanity does not have access to the Father's house, to God's life and happiness. Only Christ can open to manking do died acres, only Christ. And He has. This is why he came down from heaven, lived, died and rose again: that he might bring us to God. So let's not underrate the Ascension. Christ only leaves us to return to us. So, if the first grace of the Ascension for us, is hope In heaven, a second is fearlessness in the face of life and the sufferings and evils of life, but a humble, trusting, hoping, praying fearlessness. Today he ascends to become our Priest, our Advocate, our Intercessor. He is the One eternally turned to the Father on our behalf. Now we can make our way through this life to the Father's house rejoicing. Every blessing on your families.

# May Month of Mary

For many centuries, May has been considered the "month of Mary." As new life springs up from the earth in a richness of labour and form, it is beautiful and appropriate time to honour she "from whom sprung our salvation." Our Lord Jesus Christ who suffered and rose from the dead so that Eternal life be opened for us.

Just as she was God's instrument in the coming of Christ to humanity, Mary our Lady continues to be His instrument for each one of us, individually, mediating the graces we need to live a life pleasing to her son, a life of peace and interior joy, and interceding for us before him. In Fatima in 1971, she told us to pray the rosary every day, to make sacrifices for the conversion of sinners and reparation to the immaculate heart of Mary. Please say the rosary each day as a family with your children. Remembering parents are the main teacher of their children's love for Jesus. Mary will help you. The rosary is the most powerful prayer, after the Eucharist.
