Today is the feast of All Saints and on Monday we Commemorate the Faithful departed. We remember those who have gone before us marked with the sign of faith. In this process the faithful departed depend on the communion of saints; they depend both on the intercession of the saints in heaven and upon the prayers of Body of Christ. Updates On Covid-19 Restrictions – England

Regarding the position of churches in the event of escalation, Public Health England has stated that Places of Worship pose a low to medium risk of virus transmission and they have high confidence in this assessment. When Canon Christopher Thomas, General Secretary of the Bishops' Conference, questioned the science about the potential closure of churches, they reiterated the fact that churches in the main do not pose a high risk because of the Covid security that has been adopted. I am grateful for the excellent arrangements in place in our parishes. It is, of course, essential that we maintain our very high standard of Covid security in churches. There is still no movement from PHE on the issue of singing in church. If this should change, I will let you know.

BISHOP'S UPDATE

Yet I have been astonished at the sheer hard work, courage and creativity that have enabled our churches to re-open albeit under such very difficult circumstances. All of us - priests, deacons and seminarians - have found these last months' painful. We are anxious about our people, our buildings and our finances. No easy words from me are appropriate here; consolations and comforts seem to lie in an unknown future. I am so grateful to all those in the diocese who have worked so hard clergy, parishioners, the Covid19 Working Group and many others have been unstinting in their efforts. We pray for the grace to endure.

In this morning's news we were warned to expect a "Digital Christmas". I end with a Christmas poem about St. Joseph's lesson for his foster Son and His priests. I am Joseph, carpenter Of David's kingly line, I wanted an heir; discovered My wife's son wasn't mine.

I am an obstinate lover, Loved Mary for better or worse. Wouldn't stop loving when I found Someone Else came first.

Mine was the likeness I hoped for When the first-born man-child came. But nothing of him was me. I couldn't Even choose his name.

I am Joseph, who wanted To teach my own boy how to live. My lesson for my foster son; Endure. Love. Give.

IN TODAY'S GOSPEL

The wonderful feast-day of All Saints or All Hallows, as it used to be called, invites us to do what we probably rarely do: think about heaven and those who enjoy its blessing! The truth is that, in the course of our day or week or year, not many of us think about heaven. Today we commemorate, remember, and rejoice in all those who have gone before us marked with the sign of faith and have



attained (by God's free grace) the beatific vision of heaven. Heaven is our blessed hope; it is our destiny and our goal and purpose. We are all on pilgrimage returning to the Father of the heavenly light. Indeed, we begin the prayer of all prayers by proclaiming this truth, "Our Father, who art in heaven", for heaven is where the Father is. But what is heaven and what is it like? Heaven is a communion of perfect life and perfect love with the Trinity, the Virgin Mary, the angels and all the blessed. It is the ultimate end and fulfilment of the deepest human longings, a state of supreme and definitive happiness. St Clement of Alexandria said: "We are made for the contemplation of heaven, and we are in truth a heavenly plant, intended and created to come to the knowledge of God". Perhaps in the end it is the saints themselves who have the clearest insight into heaven because on earth as the blessed they were the nearest to it by the virtuous and gracious lives they lived. St. Francis of Sales, for example, said: "This world is only peopled in order to people heaven".

Our problem with heaven, if we are honest, is that it can seem remote and distant, and we don't want to be too presumptuous. It is a lovely thought, for sure, but we all have the nitty-gritty day-to-day to get our minds, heads, and hearts around. Consider then the wisdom of St. John Henry Newman who said, "Heaven is at present out of sight, but in due time, as snow melts and discovers what it lay upon, so will this visible creation fade away before those greater splendours which are behind it".

A continual looking forward to the eternal world is not a form of escapism or wishful thinking, but one of the things a Christian is meant to do.
