IN TODAY'S GOSPEL

Today begins the most important week of the Church's year. What are we meant to receive from it? How can we best participate in it? We are accustomed to celebrating the Church's year spread over 12 months: Advent to Christmas, Christmas to Lent, Easter to Pentecost, Pentecost to the Feast of Christ the King. At the dawn of the Church's life, however, the celebration of this whole cycle was focused on one event: Easter. It was not until the fourth century that the annual liturgical cycle began to take the shape it has today. Ask yourself: what's the purpose of these liturgical celebrations, especially that of Palm Sunday? Certainly, the Church makes a memorial of the events of our salvation, but it's so much more than an anniversary or a re-enactment. In the liturgy the once and for all events of our salvation, especially Jesus' death and resurrection, are celebrated and by the power of the Holy Spirit they're made real and present in our midst. Jesus' coming into Jerusalem on a donkey is made sacramentally present to us today. Zechariah prophesied that the Lord would enter Jerusalem to establish his dominion, 'from sea to sea, and from the River to the ends of the earth' (Zech. 9: IO). By entering Jerusalem in this way Jesus acted out his prophecy: Lo, your king comes to you: triumphant and victorious is he, humble and riding on an ass, on a colt the foal of an ass.' (Zech. 9:9). Jesus revealed his destiny to establish God's kingdom on earth, but this could only be established through his cross, death and resurrection. The same crowd who hailed him as he entered Jerusalem are the same crowd who clamoured for his execution.

Contemplate, if you will, the following words of St Andrew of Crete: It is ourselves that we must spread under Christ's feet, not coats or lifeless branches or shoots of trees, matters which waste away and delight the eye only for a few hours. No, we have clothed ourselves with Christ's grace.'for as many of you as were baptized into Christ have put on Christ, let us spread ourselves like coats under his feet.'

Welcome to our parish family and those of you who are visitors to our Sunday celebration of the Pascal Mysteries.

In today's first reading the Lord reveals himself as the faithful husband who, through His servant, wants to forgive His 'unfaithful' and 'forsaken' wife, Israel and restore her to the place of blessing. What we hear today is part of the servant's response to the Lord's mission. The servant is clear about his Master's authority. He reveals that he is not acting on his own, but on the Master's behalf. He points out that he

is awakened each morning to hear what the Lord speaks. The servant also attests His submission to suffering. He reminds us, unlike Israel, he has not turned away from God, even if His mission involves suffering. The servant goes on to say His unwavering confidence and assurance in the help of the Lord. The message for us is that God has chosen all of us Christians as his servants and wants us to be a people to serve. The Word of God is our training to be the servant of God. Like Jesus, we should constantly seek our Father's guidance so that we can bring His Word, the Light of Christ, into those who live in darkness, despair and suffering. Like Jesus, we must put all our hope and trust in God. He will help us in the midst of our trials and will not bring on us the humiliation of trusting in a false hope.

Today's reading ends "The Lord comes to my help, so that I am untouched by the insults. So too, I set my face like flint; I know I shall not be ashamed".

As we enter today into Holy Week, may we throw off the world's temptations and put our Dear Saviour, Jesus Christ at the centre of our hearts and lives. We adore you dear Lord because by your suffering, death and resurrection you have redeemed me and the world. Pope Francis says "If we are united to Jesus, faithful to him, we will be able to confront with hope and serenity even the passage of death. If my life has been a path with the Lord of trust in his immense mercy, I will be prepared to accept the last moments of my earthly existence as the definitive trustful abandonment in his receiving hands in awaiting to contemplate him face to face".

May God Bless you and your families as we near Holy Week.

To take our place amongst this great company and to receive the grace of Holy Communion, should involve some preparation, in order that we can abandon ourselves more completely to the saving mysteries that we celebrate. To that end I would appreciate if we could come to our sacred celebration with a deep sense of reverence. I ask in particular that all ministers of word and sacrament not to wear shorts even if you're not ministering (in case you are asked). Remember "This is the bread which comes down from heaven, so that one may eat of it and not die. I am the living bread which came down from heaven. Whoever eats of this bread will live forever, and the bread that I will give for the life of the Lord is my flesh (John 6:50-51)". Every truth, every hope, healing and consolation are to be found in these words of Christ. They are why, for over 2000 years, Catholics have faithfully obeyed Christ's command at the Last Supper, "Do this in memory of me."

What are they and how do they work?

A QR (Quick Response) code works in the same way as a barcode at the supermarket. It is a machine-scannable image that can instantly be read using a Smartphone camera. Every QR code consists of a number of black squares and dots which represent certain pieces of information. In our instance, the QR code will take you directly to a website where you can make your donation digitally, instead of using cash. The Diocese is wanting ALL churches to use this form of giving to replace cash which is time consuming and expensive to count and check.

Using the QR code enables the parish to save time and money - both of which are very welcome! So please don't forget that if you normally donate cash weekly, then please use the QR codes which can be found on the back page of the newsletter each week. This helps to keep the money coming in while reducing the amount of cash that we have to count, double check and then take to the bank. And amazingly some banks have actually stopped taking cash!
