A Giant, smashable, Golden Easter Egg made from Belgian chocolate and filled with Easter treats!


Jack and the beanstalk has been given a chocolate makeover! This showstopping, Giant Golden Egg is made from a thick layer of Belgian milk

Journey Home - continued

The cross transforms everything. An instrument of execution and death has become an instrument of life. Jesus did not recoil from his destiny: he recognised that in the cross his 'hour' had come and that his whole life had been a journey to this moment.

So much of Jesus' teaching is taken from observing the natural world. He took note of a principle within nature that life is born from death. We all understand that in order for a plant to grow, a seed needs first to be buried in the earth. Unless this happens, it remains only a single seed – if buried in the soil, then many seeds are produced. Jesus saw his own death mirrored in this process of nature. Jesus knew that his entire life was a preparation for his suffering and death upon the cross. In the history of the world there has never been a more important death, for from this death would come life for the world.
