IN TODAY'S GOSPEL

Although deeply spiritual and theologically profound, St. John's Gospel records some very personal moments in the life of Jesus, such as when he wept at the death of Lazarus, and the incident recorded in today's Gospel when the risen Lord cooked his disciples a fish breakfast, inviting them to 'Come and have breakfast'. We

learn that God cares for us, body and soul. By death the soul is separated from the body, but our hope is that they will be reunited on the last day. The resurrection of Jesus revealed the nature of this new body - a risen body, infused with God's light and life, and not prone to sin and death. The breakfast story leads into a fascinating exchange between Jesus and Peter, in which the fisherman was asked three times to feed the Lord's sheep. What did this mean? It meant that as the Rock he was called to ensure that believers were fed with the nourishment of Christ. We see this in Peter's first letter: 'Like newborn babies, crave pure spiritual milk, so that by it you may grow up in your salvation, now that you have tasted that the Lord is good'. One way we can literally feed off this pure spiritual milk is by prayerfully studying and meditating on Peter's two letters. When we do this, we draw directly from the original rock on which the Church was built, the pure well of our salvation.

If we do not feed, we grow weak and unhealthy. The same is true in our spiritual lives and the staple diet from which we feed is: prayer, the Scriptures, the teaching of the Church (the Magisterium) and lectio divina (spiritual reading). Supremely we feed from the Eucharist, food for our soul and food which is good for this life and the next. God has given us rich sources of spiritual food - we do not live in a parched land, but rather a banquet of teaching and spiritual life has been prepared for us. Just as with our physical bodies, eating on the run is not ideal: we need to carve out time and space with the Lord when we can be nourished by him.

Lord, we give you praise and thanks for the table from which we feed - the Word of God, the tradition of the Church, and the source and summit of our faith, the holy Eucharist.

Welcome to all our parishioners and visitors to our parish. We are still rejoicing the light of the Risen Lord.

I ask you all to pray for an end to the recent violence in our troubled world and for all who have lost their lives and that all will come together for peace.

Today's Gospel has two parts: First the disciples are out in the boat fishing and catching nothing. At dawn they saw someone standing on the shore. The stranger then told them to cast out their nets and caught 150 big fish.

Peter then recognised Jesus and they went ashore, and Jesus invited them to have breakfast – bread, wine and fish. Remember at the Last Supper the words "you will know me in the breaking of bread". The fishes were the sign of the new covenant. They used the word fishes to disguise their identity in times of persecution. The letter ichthy, which means fish, is also the form of the first letter of each of the Greek words Jesus Christ Son and Saviour. So John wants us to know that the Risen Lord was not only among the disciples but is among us as well. That same tradition has been passed down. The Mass is called the breaking of bread and we receive it to confirm and know that Jesus is with us.

The Second part of the Gospel is the dialogue between Jesus and Peter - the one who betrayed him three times. Jesus asks Peter three times - do you love me? The key is not in the forgiveness but in the loving. So for us today, we can ask ourselves, do we recognise Jesus in the breaking of bread, and when we come to Jesus seeking his forgiveness we are also looking for his love. Can we, like Peter, say yes Lord, you know that I love you from the depth of my heart. If we can then we should hunger for the Bread of Life.

Have a great Sunday with your families as we continue this great Easter Season.
