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



IN TODAY'S GOSPEL

Money is a paradox. It makes the world go round but the love of it is the root of all evil (1 Tim. 6:10). Note that the root of all evil here is the love of money, not money itself. Dorothy Parker once said. 'If you want to know what God thinks of money, just look at the people he gave it to.' In our wealth-obsessed culture the wealthy attract our admiration and respect.

It has been suggested that the worldwide economic recession resulted from greed and the thirst for huge bonuses from within the banking community. Basically, the banks gave mortgages to millions of people who simply couldn't afford to repay their debt. These lenders landed in real trouble as mortgage rates rose and house prices fell, causing millions to default and lose their homes. The rot set in when bankers became less interested in building long-term prosperity for the bank itself and more concerned about hitting their own annual bonus targets. The Parable of the Shrewd Manager is a story about a canny manager who, to use a modern turn of phrase, knew which side his bread was buttered on. What's interesting about him is that until the moment of his sacking, he was wasteful and incompetent, but when he realized that he was about to lose everything, he made shrewd plans to ensure that he was provided for. Jesus doesn't commend the manager's mismanagement of his master's resources, but he does commend his shrewd planning.

The conclusion Jesus draws is that the children of this world are often more shrewd in dealing with their own kind than the children of the light are. He's saying that we need to make use of all that God has given us in order to bear witness, preach and proclaim the Gospel. We have to be shrewd ourselves and invest wisely in how we spend our time, energy, money and resources so that we don't work for food that spoils but for food that endures to eternal life (John 6:27).

Lord, by the grace of your Spirit you give us a wisdom that the world cannot provide, which makes us both shrewd in the way we deal with others and wise in the way of salvation.

Welcome to all of our parish family and visitors to our Sunday celebration of the Mass.

I first want to hope you all had a lovely summer and enjoyed your holiday whichever country you visited. Now we are back to a very busy time between now and Christmas. It is very encouraging to see many more returning to Our Sunday Obligation of Mass. I want to remind you how to participate more fully in the Mass. Firstly, to refrain from food and drink (except water and medicines) one hour before Mass is a physical reminder that we hunger for Christ who will feed us with His own divine life in Holy Communion. The elderly and those who are suffering from some illness, as well

as those who care for them, may receive Holy Communion even if they have consumed something during the preceding hour.

Secondly, please aim to arrive in good time. If you come to Mass harassed and 'on the run' then there will be little opportunity to still your mind and recollect your heart. This may prove a challenge even at the best of times, but it should remain a spiritual goal. Thirdly, the psalmist sings 'Truly I have set my soul/in silence and peace' (psalm 31) and adults should try to do so as well because silence makes us more sensitive to the presence of Christ. When we are silent, we do not hear less, we hear more. We become attuned to the stirrings of the Holy Spirit within us. Silence does not happen automatically. It is created by the work of each member of the worshiping assembly. As we come to Mass, we need to commit ourselves to cultivating the reverent silence of the Mass. Fourthly, coming into the presence of God, the All Holy One, should make us more sensitive to the barriers we have placed between ourselves and Him by our sinfulness and lack of faith. Bringing a contrite heart before God, we also recognise how rich He is in mercy and forgiveness, how slow to anger. Fifth, if the readings at Mass are to ignite our hearts and make them burn with love for God then they must not only be proclaimed with conviction, but need to be listened to with an attentive ear and open heart. Spending a little time with the readings before coming to Sunday Mass will allow God's word to take seed in the soil of our lives. And finally, at the altar, the priest prays in the person of Christ, the High Priest, and on behalf of the whole Church. This prayer offers thanksgiving to God for bringing everything into being and sustaining it in being. It also recalls the Last Supper and by the power of the Holy Spirit, the salvation offered once and for all by Christ becomes real and truly present to us: bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Christ, our Holy Communion. The Eucharistic Prayer concludes with the priest recognising that 'all glory and honour is yours forever and ever' to which everyone responds with a great Amen. This

I hope you will all find the above helpful as you come to the awesome presence of the Lord each day/week, and help participate more fully in the celebration of Mass. May God bless you all and keep safe

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Celebrating the beauty of our Faith

On 18 September 2022, Evangelii Gaudium Sunday, calls us to be joyous in proclaiming our faith. "Evangelii Gaudium" is Latin for "Joy of the Gospel". The day supports the work carried out by the Mission Directorate at the Bishops' Conference in supporting our bishops in three important areas:

- Firstly, evangelisation and catechesis. Guided by the Bishops, this work supports the dioceses in bringing the beauty of the Catholic Faith to the people in their parishes, and to those who do not yet know the Lord.
- Secondly, the beauty of the Liturgy and our church buildings. The Mission directorate ensures that liturgical directives from Rome are acted upon and liturgical texts are translated into English. Historical building experts work in the Directorate and support dioceses to fund and maintain beautiful places for prayer.
- Thirdly, sharing the beauty of the Catholic faith with Christian and non-Christians through outreach and dialogue. This work supports the bishops at the national level and helps create greater understanding. The directorate also reaches out to those with no faith, but who seek the Lord "with a sincere heart"
