Lenten Reflection: "Shake off all your sins - it is the Lord who speaks - and make yourselves a new heart and a new spirit" Welcome to our parish family and to our visitors to our celebration of the Most Holy Eucharist. We are now getting close to Holy Week, the great week of the church's year. Remember during Lent we are called to pray, fasting and abstinence. Our lives during Lent should be different than normally. We are preparing to walk with Jesus to His death and Resurrection to redeem you and I from our sins. It's a time when we look at ourselves and seek the mercy and forgiveness of Jesus in the Sacrament of Confession. It's a time to

make an effort to follow the way of the cross on Friday evening, or purchase a copy of the Stations of the Cross to say at home with your families. Or to say one Station of the Cross each evening.

Likewise with the Rosary. Can you imagine the anguish and sorrow when Mary held her dead Son in her arms? Through our sins we are the cause, but His death and Resurrection is His forgiveness for our waywardness. Jesus said "If you want to be a follower of me, you have to deny yourself and take up your cross and follow me". This Lent provides an opportunity to follow Jesus by loving God and our neighbour. An opportunity to accept our crosses in life and to trust in God's will, whatever that might be, and to reach out to the sick, the homeless, and the lonely and to daily pray for peace in our world.

In the book of Deuteronomy, Chapter 26 we hear "You have today made this declaration about the Lord; that he will be your God, only if you follow his ways, keep his statutes, his commandments, his ordinances, and listen to his voice".
