Every Sunday afternoon we have the opportunity to pray before the Blessed Sacrament. This is an opportunity to find that peace and tranquillity before Jesus in the Most Blessed Sacrament. Pope Benedict XV1 said "We kneel only before God or before the Blessed Sacrament because we know and believe that the one true God is present in it, the God who created the world and so loved it that he gave his Only Begotten Son. We prostrate ourselves before a God who....knelt before us to wash our dirty feet. Adoring the Body of Christ, means believing that there, in that piece of Bread, Christ is really there, and gives true sense to life, to the immense universe as to the smallest creature, to the whole of human history as to the most brief existence. Adoration is prayer that prolongs the celebration and Eucharistic communion and in which the soul continues to be nourished: it is nourished with love, truth, peace; it is nourished with hope, because the One before whom we prostrate ourselves does not judge us, does not crush us but liberates and transform us". (Mass of Corpus Christi).

It can be said after a meal or in our daily prayers or any time during the day. They need our prayers.

You have the parent's guide to help you in this very important ministry so that your children will come to understand how they need to forgive each other or their friends who hurt them in words or actions or a failure to keep God's commandments.


Baptism

Gift Aid & Standing Orders

By Gift Aiding your donation it means that for every £1 that you give to our parish, we are able to claim back from HMRC an extra 25p. If you are a Tax Payer, you are able to join our Gift Aid scheme by downloading the Gift Aid form from the parish website www.stjosephshutton.org

The Gift Aid form needs to be returned to the parish office and you will be issued with a Gift Aid number, which you will use whenever you make a donation to the church.

We would also encourage you to consider setting up a standing order to the parish. Standing orders enable us to budget more effectively and they mean that you don't need to bring money with you when you come to Mass, except when we have a second collection. Pope on Social Media

I continue to think about the serious situation in Palestine and in Israel where many, many people have lost their lives. In God's name, I beg you to stop: cease using weapons! I hope that avenues will be pursued so that an escalation of the conflict might be absolutely avoided.

The presence of children is a sign that goes straight to the hearts of all adults. It is the voice of innocence that questions us and makes us think, that forces us to ask ourselves: What are we doing with our world, our planet, our society? What future are we preparing for you?

Let the hostages be freed immediately. Let's think of the children, of all the children affected by this war, as well as in Ukraine and by other conflicts: this is how their future is being killed. Let us pray that there might be the strength to say, "enough".

I am near to the population of Nepal who is suffering because of an earthquake, as well as the Afghan refugees who have found refuge in Pakistan but now do not know where to go. I pray also for the victims of the storms and floods in Italy and other countries.
