IN TODAY'S GOSPEL

There's a real sense of urgency in today's Gospel, which is contrasted with the more relaxed approach in 1 Kings, where Elisha is allowed time to say goodbye to his family before joining Elijah in his ministry. As Jesus' Passion draws ever nearer, the Lord's call to his potential disciples to follow him allows them no time. They must be willing to put service of the Lord before every other call in their life, even seemingly legitimate ones. This high level of commitment can lead to a feeling among the laity that Jesus' words don't apply to them, just to the clergy or missionaries. This, however, isn't the case. The Lord's call to 'Follow me' applies to all believers. To follow the Lord with great urgency can even occur within a family home. Following him may mean turning away from the television and instead praying a Rosary. Or picking up the telephone and calling that relative or friend you've been meaning to speak to for some time.

In order to fulfil Christ's mandate to 'spread the news of the kingdom of God' (Luke 9:2), it's necessary to have a sense of urgency every day. By asking the Holy Spirit for guidance, and being led away from the trap of our routines, the Lord presents us with constant challenges that will bring fresh insight to our faith. One example of this is St. Catherine of Siena. In her youth she lived in an incredibly crowded house, but, amidst the hustle and bustle of her family home, she consistently withdrew and sought the Lord out in prayer.


A little later in Luke's Gospel Jesus sends his disciples out in pairs and we're told they come back rejoicing (10:17). The Lord's sense of urgency wasn't lost on them and they joined in his radical style of life. This sense of urgency still exists today, particularly in the face of growing secularism in Western Europe. The Lord says to all of us, 'Follow me'. What will our response be?

'Eternal God…do not permit that Your Son, Our Lord, remain unknown by unbelievers, but, with the help of Your saints and the Church… remember Your mercy, forget their idolatry., and make them know Him.' (St. Francis Xavier)

In case you have been on holiday, may I remind you that the Bishops of England and Wales reimposed the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays which was relaxed during Covid. It is a serious sin to miss Mass. If you do so you need to go to the Sacrament of Confession before you receive Holy Communion.

Only those who are sick or the housebound are exempted.

In today's gospel Jesus reminds us of the road we need to take as we journey to eternal life. Jesus took the road resolutely for Jerusalem. He sent messengers ahead to prepare for his visit, but we are told they rejected them. We like to remain in our comfort zone. Yet we are confronted often with the choice of either departing from our old ways of life or clinging to it. Our world offers us many different ways. St. Paul in his letter to the Galatians says "The freedom that he proclaims is that which sets us free from the yoke of slavery to destructive habits and the freedom that enables us to serve one another through love; the freedom to break free from the old unredeemed, unrefined and raw self to embrace a new and transformed nature".


We all long and wish to embrace a new and transformed life, but we are often caught in traps of procrastination and hesitation. Jesus invites us to follow Him. You go and proclaim the kingdom without delay. Pray that we love our Catholic faith. Teach it to your children. Reflect on how we live the gospel. In the Book of Proverbs (3:5-6) "Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your understanding; in all your ways acknowledge him and he will direct your paths". Pray to the Holy Spirit to make the right decisions and examine the different options available to us We also ask the Holy Spirit to teach us the way we must go. Do not let ignorance lead us down the wrong path. May we not stray from the way of truth and what is right, weak and sinful as we are. Let us all journey together with all our brothers and sisters to eternal life.




What are they and how do they work?

A QR (Quick Response) code works in the same way as a barcode at the supermarket. It is a machine-scannable image that can instantly be read using a Smartphone camera. Every QR code consists of a number of black squares and dots which represent certain pieces of information. In our instance, the QR code will take you directly to a website where you can make your donation digitally, instead of using cash. The Diocese is wanting ALL churches to use this form of giving to replace cash which is time consuming and expensive to count and check.

Using the QR code enables the parish to save time and money - both of which are very welcome! So please don't forget that if you normally donate cash weekly, then please use the QR codes which can be found on the back page of the newsletter each week. This helps to keep the money coming in while reducing the amount of cash that we have to count, double check and then take to the bank. And amazingly some banks have actually stopped taking cash!
