

Journey Home Threshold of Hope – Please read each week - (Continued)

Jesus, in order to save us and reconcile us with the Father, desired to give his life for us as a sacrifice on the cross: 'Jesus... who for the sake of the joy that was set before him endured the cross, disregarding its shame...' He knew that carrying out his Father's will would inevitably bring him suffering and death: '...the Son of man will be delivered... to the Gentiles to be mocked... flogged and crucified. That's why, when Peter attempted to persuade him not to do God's will to avoid suffering and death, Jesus sternly rebuked him: 'You are a hindrance to me; for you are setting your mind not on divine things, but on human things'. Jesus was willing to pay the full cost; in the courage and power of the Spirit he endured all his sufferings 'with loud cries and tears.' 'Teach us, good Lord, to serve thee as thou deservest; to give and not to count the cost; to fight and not to heed the wounds; to toil and not to seek for rest; to labour and not to ask for any reward, save that of knowing that we do thy will.'
