

# IN TODAY'S GOSPEL

Good things can come in small packages. Today's brief reading carries quite a punch. It teaches us all we need to know about prayer; that it's in the quiet and solitude of prayer that we most effectively hear the Lord's voice. For sure, in the hustle and bustle of daily life and through the pangs of conscience the Lord prompts, urges and guides us, but it's primarily in prayer that we, his sheep, hear his voice.

The practice of taking time out to be still with the Lord is in decline and it has become fashionable these days to speak of one's whole life being a prayer: we can be too busy to carve out space in our busy schedules to pray so we offer up prayers as we move through our day. God is so much part and parcel of life that spontaneous, intimate chat becomes second nature. While no one can deny the importance of having an ongoing conversation with the Lord through the course of our day, the wise advice of St. Teresa of Avila speaks down the centuries to us today: 'We are always in the presence of God, yet it seems to me that those who pray are in His presence in a very different sense.'

One of the real problems we have concerning prayer is deciding to carve out the time. When we have so much to do, the idea of taking time out to pray can seem impractical and unreasonable. The benefits and blessings of prayer, however, far outweigh the very real and very pressing demands of our frantic and frenetic schedules, as the Holy Spirit will reveal to us, if we allow him to. It's the gentle voice of the Spirit who invites us into God's presence so that we can be renewed and refreshed in body and spirit. Blessed Mother Teresa of Calcutta, whose dedicated service to the poor was rooted in prayer and the Eucharist, said, 'Prayer enlarges the heart until it is capable of containing God's gift of Himself.'

Welcome to our parish family and to our visitors to our parish celebration.

This coming Saturday our young children will be making their First Holy Communion. Please pray that they and their parents will be faithful to the Sacraments in their lives. This encounter with Jesus is important to keep alive within their souls as every truth, every hope, healing and consolation are to be found in the words of Christ "Whoever eats of this bread will live forever, and the bread that I will give for the life of the world is my flesh".

In the domestic church, which is your home, your children will grow in their love for Jesus through your example and through being brought up in the love of Jesus, while challenging them to be kind , compassionate, forgiving, understanding, merciful and caring for their family members and their friends. You will always be the main teachers of the faith for your children and to set the example for them.

We also want to encourage all our families to pray the rosary each day. This is such a powerful prayer to Mary our Mother as we contemplate the life and death and resurrection of her Son Jesus.

Today's Gospel reflection is about Jesus as the Good Shepherd. Jesus pronounced them: during the feast of the Dedication of the Temple, sometime before the Passover when Christ was arrested and condemned to death.... But you can also read them in the light of the Resurrection of the Lord and in the Spirit of Pentecost.

Today, the risen Jesus is in Heaven, in the glory and splendour of the Father, he and the Father sending the Spirit of love and peace to the entire world. The Holy Spirit whom the Father will send in my name, he will teach you everything, and bring to you all that I have said to you (Jn 14:26). Let us open our hearts to Jesus as we receive Him in Holy Communion so that Jesus will be able to speak the word 'I and the Father are one' on our behalf.

Let us always ask Mary, who is the closest to him, to help us to receive within us the eternal Life that is in Jesus - Eucharist. Thank you all for your support and let us encourage one another to return to our parish family each week so that we can encounter him in the Eucharist.

Finally, a reminder that we are expected to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation at least once a year between Easter and Trinity Sunday (the Sunday after Pentecost). You can go to any church to receive this Sacrament and receive the graces which flow from the Sacraments.

May God bless our families and bring to eternal life all who have died.

# Synod Prayer

We stand before You, Holy Spirit, as we gather together in Your name. With You alone to guide us, make Yourself at home in our hearts; Teach us the way we must go and how we are to pursue it. We believe that the teachings of the Catholic Church are true and that, as Jesus tells us 'The truth will set you free' (Jn8:32). The church draws its teaching from Jesus Christ, who was both a human being and the son of God. Because of this Jesus understands the human condition like no one else and offers the divine light into the question. "What is the meaning of life." In Jesus of Nazareth we encounter the face of God who came down from heaven and immersed himself in the human world and to teach "the art of living", the road to happiness to set us free from sin and make us children of God. The holy Mass is the pivotal act of worship in the Catholic Faith. Prayer helps us to come to know that we are loved, known and cherished by God. There are many ways to pray and perhaps we can start that every time we pass a church, we can give five minutes to light a candle and go on our knees or sitting down. We can make a prayer corner in our home (the domestic church) but here in the church in the tabernacle, we believe that truly we meet Christ.

# **First Holy Communion Day**



Our children will be making their first Holy Communion on Saturday 14 May at 11.00 a.m. We have all participated recently in the Easter Triduum on the day of the Last Supper, the priest consecrates the bread and wine and by the power of the Holy Spirit, they are totally changed into the substance of the Body and Blood of Christ. This change is called transubstantiation. In this change the crucified and risen Lord is truly present to his church and he calls us to share in his divine life. In Holy Communion, it is nothing less than Christ's Body & Blood, Soul, and Divinity that we receive. We are drawn into communion with God, the All Holly One. We live in the life of the Blessed Trinity.

This is an awesome moment in the life of your child. A life that you as parents have the responsibility to nurture and enter into the very life of Jesus Christ – food for the soul as he or she journeys to Eternal life. As parents and as a community we must set the example of attending Sunday Mass. This must be for each one of us a priority in our lives. Please pray for our children and parents and all of us that this may be, so Christ promises us that "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him (Jn 6:54,56). The mass is the source of true freedom and witness.

#### MASS OF THANKSGIVING FOR MARRIAGE AND FAMILY LIFE

In terms of diocesan events to mark the end of the Year of the Family, our focus is on relaunching the Mass of Thanksgiving for Marriage and Family Life after a Covid enforced hiatus. In addition to the prayer cards, Bishop Alan will be celebrating in the Cathedral at 3.00 p.m. on Saturday 16 July. Mass will be followed by a reception in the hall. As part of the Year of the Family we will be inviting people to send in their own prayer requests via our website, and these will be placed before the altar at this Mass and included in the intentions for the Mass.

For those attending there are no special car parking arrangements, therefore they should come early and be prepared to use one of the public car parks in Brentwood or travel via public transport as the cathedral car park will fill up very quickly.

#### WALSINGHAM PILGRIMAGE

As you will be aware from the information Fr. Daniel Kelly has already sent out, we are also keen to encourage families to take part in the diocesan pilgrimage to Walsingham on Saturday 28 May. We have tried to identify things that will make the day easier for parents with young children and help them and their children get as much out of the day as possible. Plans include setting aside a room at the shrine for the use of families during the day, and designating a time when families can visit the slipper Chapel without fear of disturbing the prayer of others, when there will also be a family rosary led by one of the Community of Our Lady of Walsingham. We will also be producing a special liturgy and activity booklet for the children. If in the past parents have expressed any concerns about coming to Walsingham with the diocese it would be useful to know what these concerns are so that we can try and address them.



Let us #PrayTogether so that all young people, called to live life to the fullest, may discover in Mary's life the way to listen, the depth of discernment, the courage of faith, and dedication to service.

On this World #PressFreedom Day, let us #PrayTogether for the journalists who pay in person, with their lives or imprisonment, to serve this right. Special thanks to those who courageously inform us of the wounds of humanity.

In this month dedicated to the Virgin Mary, let us learn from her that #prayer is the best weapon of Christian life; without persistent prayer, no victory over evil is possible.

I beg you, let us not surrender to the logic of violence, to the perverse spiral of weapons. May the path of dialogue and peace be taken!


