Journey Home Threshold of Hope – Please read each week - (Continued)

Jesus captured the heart of the Ten Commandments when he said, 'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart.... With all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and first commandment. And the second is like it: "You shall love your neighbour as yourself." He brought together the first three of the Ten Commandments under his first commandment to love God, and the remaining seven under his second commandment to love our neighbour. He also declared that this was the heart of the teaching of the law and the prophets.

So, why does God require us to love not only him but also our neighbour? God has revealed himself as '... merciful and gracious, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love and faithfulness.' He shows mercy towards us by forgiving us our sins, reconciling us to himself and adopting us as his beloved children. Because of the mercy and kindness that he bestows upon us, he demands that we respond to him with love, and with heartfelt appreciation and gratitude for all that he has done for us. But since he's shown mercy to every single person that he's created, he also requires that we don't withhold mercy and kindness from others, since they're our brothers and sisters. Lord Jesus, help me to live out the heart of the

commandments by loving you and my neighbour to the best of my ability.
