

IN TODAY'S GOSPEL

In today's reading we encounter the very real tension which exists between the external religious life (exemplified in the teachers of the law and the Pharisees) and the beauty of the interior life expressed in humble love, service and generosity towards God. Perhaps there is a way in which this tension exists in us all to

The fault of the Pharisees was that they loved the recognition, praise, status, social standing and affirmation which has, since time immemorial, been the privilege of those who enjoy elevated status within the community. They enjoyed it, milked it and even financially exploited it. However, their external adherence to the Torah had no impact on the evil and darkness within their own hearts. They assumed a holiness and righteousness which simply did not exist in reality.

The temptation to rely on status and position must be very real for all bishops, priests, deacons and religious, but it's equally real for all of us who are baptised and serve in some capacity or other in our parishes or local communities. We should not seek our security and affirmation from external things but from God and in humbly serving him and our brothers and sisters.

The poor widow had the right attitude: she had the disposition of a true disciple. She was aware of her poverty, and was under no illusion who she was socially or before God. Another woman who had the disposition of a true disciple was Jeanne Jugan, the foundress of the Little Sisters of the Poor. Although she was removed from all responsibility and given the task of collecting money, food and clothing for the poor - by going both door-todoor and begging in the streets - she accepted this obscure new role willingly and without complaint. To further humiliations she answered with silence, gentleness and abandonment to the will of God. Humility was at the heart of her spirituality, as it was for the poor widow.



Journey Home (Continued):

By Loving God and our neighbour,
The call of the gospel to love challenges each one
of us to respond by looking beyond ourselves to
the needs of others. In part, our response will depend on our state of life. For example, the reality of
the cross embraced by the sick is different from
the one inspiring the young adult volunteering at a
refugee centre or the one challenging parents to be
the best and first teacher of the faith to their childrep. Each of us, in our own way, makes real

the best and first teacher of the faith to their children. Each of us, in our own way, makes real Christ's sacrificial love in our world, a love that has a special concern for the weakest, the poorest and the most despised. The catechism of the Catholic church notes that "the eucharist commits us to the poor" (no 1397).

The body of Christ that is broken for us at mass moves us to respond to all that is broken, bruised ad hurting in humanity. The blood of Christ shed for us provides us with the grace to shed our own self esteem – self interest in loving service to others. The honour we offered the eucharist compels us to honour those considered 'the least' by the world. If you wish to be confirmed next year, please give me in writing your name and contact details. You should be 14+. The preparation course begins in January 2022. Confirmation is the second sacrament where you will be anointed with the fullness of the Holy Spirit and his Gifts. By this anointing the confirmed receives to 'seal' or 'mark' of the Holy Spirit. A seal is a sign of authority or ownership of the object. Christ himself declared that he was marked with his father's seal. The seal of the Holy Spirit makes our total belonging to Christ, our enrolment in his service for ever, as well as promise of divine protection. In the prayer....."Send your Holy Spirit to be their helper and guide - give them the spirit of Wisdom and understanding, right judgement, courage, knowledge, reverence, spirit of wonder and Love".... QR Codes

What are they and how do they work?

A QR (Quick Response) code works in the same way as a barcode at the supermarket. It is a machine-scannable image that can instantly be read using a Smartphone camera. Every QR code consists of a number of black squares and dots which represent certain pieces of information. In our instance, the QR code will take you directly to a website where you can make your donation digitally, instead of using cash. The Diocese is wanting ALL churches to use this form of giving to replace cash which is time consuming and expensive to count and check. Using the QR code enables the parish to save time and money – both of which are very welcome!

So please don't forget that if you normally donate cash weekly, then please use the QR codes which can be found on the back page of the newsletter each week. This helps to keep the money coming in while reducing the amount of cash that we have to count, double check and then take to the bank. And amazingly some banks have actually stopped taking cash!
