

IN TODAY'S GOSPEL

Today the season of Christmastide draws to a close, and reaches a wonderful climax in a definitive event in Jesus' life: his baptism. This was a remarkable event because the baptism offered by John the Baptist was for repentance. The immersion in the waters of the Jordan was a sign of conversion, of a person changing direction in life. Iohn's message was addressed to tax collectors, soldiers, and ordinary men and women. It was a message of moral reform, of preparing for the coming of the Messiah. Jesus' baptism began his public life and in this moment God is revealed as the Blessed Trinity.

The Trinity is unique to Christianity. We are united to Muslims and Jews because we share a common belief in One God, but at this point our faiths depart sharply from one another because we believe that God is Three Persons in One God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Jesus' baptism was the manifestation, the epiphany, of Jesus as the Messiah and the Son of God.

This unveiling of Jesus' nature and mission brought forth from the Father a tender and heart-warming affirmation: 'You are my Son, whom I love; with you I am well pleased'. Jesus' baptism was the acceptance and inauguration of his mission as God's Suffering Servant. He allowed himself to be numbered among us sinners; he is truly 'the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world'.

In today's Gospel we see the 'fulfilling of all righteousness'. (Matt. 3:15). We are witnesses of Jesus consenting to submit himself entirely to his Father's will, his death on the cross for the forgiveness of our sins. The coming down of the Spirit at his baptism looked forward to the coming down of the Spirit on us - a prelude to the new creation. We commit ourselves to enter more deeply into the mystery of our baptism, praying about it, seeking to understand it, and growing in our appreciation of this wonderful grace.

'Let us be buried with Christ by baptism to rise with him; let us go down with him to be raised with him: and let us rise with him to be glorified with him'. (St Gregory of Nazianzus)

We have recently celebrated the feast of the Nativity. The birth of Jesus is the most powerful sign and message of hope in a world darkened by the fears and uncertainty caused by the pandemic of Covid. Synod Prayer

We are weak and sinful; do not let us promote disorder. Do not let ignorance lead us down the wrong path nor partiality influence our actions. Let us find in You our unity so that we may journey together to eternal life and not stray from the way of truth and what is right. All this we ask of You, who are at work in every place and time, in the communion of the Father and the Son, forever and ever. Amen.

Confirmation 2022

The sacrament of confirmation will take place later this year. You should be 14+. The preparation course begins in January 2022. We already have a few names – should you wish to receive this wonderful sacrament please contact Fr Leslie now as soon as possible.

The sacramental life of the church is important for all of us to stay close to Jesus, as we journey through life. Please pray and come forward to receive this sacrament. Confirmation is the second sacrament where you will be anointed with the fullness of the Holy Spirit and his Gifts. By this anointing the confirmed receives to 'seal' or 'mark' of the Holy Spirit. A seal is a sign of authority or ownership of the object. Christ himself declared that he was marked with his father's seal. The seal of the Holy Spirit makes our total belonging to Christ, our enrolment in his service for ever, as well as promise of divine protection. In the prayer" Send your Holy Spirit to be their helper and guide - give them the spirit of Wisdom and understanding, right judgement, courage, knowledge, reverence, spirit of wonder and Love" I ask our parents to engage in conversation about the important sacrament offered to our young teenagers for their journey in life.

Fasting – Fast from all food except bread and water for a day or fast from a particular food or luxury e.g. Chocolate, alcohol, cigarettes, iPhones, TV. Fast from whatever you can, given your state of health etc., but make sure it is something that involves a sacrifice to yourself.

Prayer – we ask you to say a Rosary (or an extra one if your already say a daily rosary). You could also make an effort to go to an extra Mass/go to the church for adoration. You can even pray before a closed tabernacle "And He said to them: This kind (or demon) can go out by nothing, but by prayer and fasting" (Mark 9:29).
