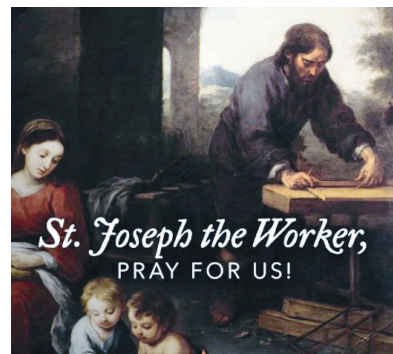

Journey Home - continued

Jesus makes two points about the temple; the first is that a destruction needs to occur, and the second is that out of this ruin and devastation a new temple will be raised up. This is an image of the death and resurrection of Jesus. As the Lord himself, and in three days I will raise it up. Jesus has replaced the temple, he is the new Temple. Jesus is now the place where we can draw close to the presence and glory of God. Jesus is the fulfilment of all that the temple meant for Israel, including its purpose in revealing sin. Sin could not be destroyed by the destruction of the temple, but it was destroyed by the death of Jesus, because Jesus took sinful humanity with him to the cross.
