IN TODAY'S GOSPEL

Jesus is confronted by an unholy alliance, an unlikely coalition of devout legalists and wealthy royalists which had been formed through their shared enmity to him. It's amazing that two such groups could get together on an issue like this - the fact that they sank their many differences to attack him just goes to show how determined their opposition was.



On the question of taxation, the two groups were poles apart. The Pharisees as religious people resented paying taxes to a foreign government. They felt that to do so cast into doubt the supreme Lordship of God over his people Israel. The Herodians, on the other hand, were friends and supporters of Herod Antipas, whom the Romans allowed to rule under them. They had no objection to paying Roman taxes. Hoping that Jesus would offend either the religious nationalists or the Roman authorities, what they wanted from him was some rash statement either in favour of Roman rule or in total rejection of it. What they got was an invitation to work out for themselves the proper interplay of religious and political loyalties.

In the ancient world coins were regarded as the private property of a ruler. Jesus argues that if you use a coin of that ruler, you put yourself under an obligation to him. It's interesting to note that Jesus does not have a coin himself, but has to ask for one to be shown. If the coin bears the image of Caesar, it belongs to him and must be given back to him. In the same way, the human person is in the image of God and our first obligation is to him. So Jesus challenges his opponents to be as observant in paying their debts to God as they are in paying their dues to the emperor.

We have a dual citizenship. We must render to God and render to Caesar. Our duties as Christians range from casting our vote to caring about our environment, from upholding the law to loving our neighbour. These obligations are part of our duty as God's people, as God desires peace and justice in this world. Above all, though, our duty is to give God what belongs to him: ourselves.

Lord, help me to live in this world as a faithful citizen of your kingdom. By your grace teach me that true dignity is rooted in the inalienable blessing of being created in your image and likeness.

Hello and welcome to our parishioners and those who have returned today for the first time. I hope that if you are able, we would love to see you so that our community remains strong and that you do not lose touch with us. We have a brand new website with our newsletter on it. Saint Sebastian was born in the third century near Milan and serve as a roman soldier. St. Sebastian converted to Christianity after seeing the courage of the Martyrs. An enthusiastic evangelist, he led many to the true faith including a Roman prefect who was healed of the plague. The Roman Emperor Diocletian was very unhappy that one of his soldiers had converted to Christianity, and had St. Sebastian put to death at the hands of the archers. Remarkably he survived and was nursed back to health. He returned to Diocletian court to persuade him to return to God. Enraged by his impudence, the Emperor ordered that he be stoned to death. Today St. Sebastian is Patron Saint of Plagues. We now ask in our prayers for his help and intercession during the Covid-19 pandemic. St. Sebastian, pray for us and keep us safe.

I also want everyone to say the Rosary to our Blessed Lady to help to find a vaccine. It would be wonderful for all our families to pray the Rosary each day and so powerful. Prayer is the most powerful weapon we have in all situations in our life.


