

IN TODAY'S GOSPEL

Scientists recently declared that they'd discovered the glimmer of a planet outside of the Milky Way (our universe), in the region of 28 million light years away. It's hard to conceive or imagine such distances or even think that there are planets far beyond our solar system. The mystery of science is great but far greater is the mystery of God.

Today we're invited to contemplate the greatest Christian mystery of all, the Blessed Trinity. Christianity departs radically from Islam and Judaism in its belief that in the one God is a communion of three persons: the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. Furthermore, Christianity professes the belief that the Second Person of the Trinity, God the Son. entered time and space and took upon himself our human nature. Belief in the Trinity, then, is a central mystery of Christian faith.

We re baptized 'in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit' (Matt. 28:19), and we're invited to develop a relationship with each person of the Blessed Trinity. Jesus' life, work, ministry, preaching and teaching all testify to this fundamental truth of Christian revelation. In fact, the doctrine of the Most Holy Trinity could be described as the central mystery of the Christian faith and life and it's this mystery that we're celebrating and rejoicing in today.

The word 'mystery' isn't used to mean a conundrum or puzzle that's impossible to solve, but a sacred truth which we will only be able to penetrate more deeply if we ask the Holy Spirit to shed his light and truth into our minds and spirits. We need to pray, 'Lord, teach me, show me, guide me, lead me into the beauty, glory and majesty of the mystery of the Blessed Trinity.'

Today we pray: 'O my God, Trinity whom I adore, help me to forget myself entirely so to establish myself in you, immovable and peaceful as if my soul were already in eternity.' (Blessed Elizabeth of the Trinity)

Welcome to our parish family on this the Feast of Pentecost. Today we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Spirit, the third person of the Most Holy Trinity. Before Jesus left the Apostles, He promised to send down on them what the Father had promised, namely the Holy Spirit. On this day He said "Receive the Holy Spirit" and said "For those whose sins you forgive, they are forgiven; for those whose sins you retain, they are retained".

The Holy Spirit will teach and keep alive all that Jesus has said and taught, but also to help you to understand it. Remember, The Holy Spirit is available in each one of us by the right of our Baptism and Confirmation. Today then we celebrate the entry of the Spirit and begin

The Apostles begin converting and the church grows through the influence of the Spirit. That is why we think of Pentecost as our birthday as a church. For each one of us, we have been through 50 days of celebration of the risen Christ - and now we begin to make Christ known to all we meet, in our families, in our community and the friends and people that we meet in our everyday lives with the help and influence of the Holy Spirit.

All our prayers should begin by invocation of the Holy Spirit such as "Come Holy Spirit, fill my heart with your love and kindle in me the fire of your love". In difficult situations, in living faithfully our Catholic faith, to help us to understand what we believe, ask for the help of the Holy Spirit and let the Holy Spirit teach you what needs to be done to be a good Christian. Let the Spirit inform your conscience to help you make decisions. Don't let the Spirit be the forgotten person of God.



Our Catholic Faith – Continued – Marriage

The sacrament of matrimony is a vow of love made before and trough God and the church, and therefore we need to approach it with reverence and awe. God has fashioned this sacrament to show forth his love and to bring life into the world.

Marriage is the call to be open to life to receive it as a gift and should bring it into the world. God has intended the act of Marital love as the means of expressing our desire for intimacy, one in which we, as responsible parents are open to the gift of life.

The sacredness of marriage is not merely a human agreement between two consenting individuals, it's a relationship before and under God (Genesis 2:22). It is a reflection of the nuptial life of the Holy Trinity.

The intimacy of marriage is the most intimate of all human relationships, uniting a man and woman in one 'flesh' union (Genesis 2:23-25). Marriage involves 'leaving one's' family of origin and being united to one's spouse.

The mutuality of marriage is a relationship of free self-giving of one human being to another (Eshesians 5:25-30). The marriage partners are to be first and foremost concerned about the wellbeing of the other person and to be committed to each other in steadfast love and devotion. This involves the need for forgiveness.

The exclusiveness of marriage is not only permanent, sacred, intimate and mutual, it is also exclusive (Genesis 2:22-25) (Corinthians 7:2-5). This means that no other human relationship must interfere with the marriage commitment between husband or wife.

QR Codes

What are they and how do they work?

A QR (Quick Response) code works in the same way as a barcode at the supermarket. It is a machine-scannable image that can instantly be read using a Smartphone camera. Every QR code consists of a number of black squares and dots which represent certain pieces of information. In our instance, the QR code will take you directly to a website where you can make your donation digitally, instead of using cash. The Diocese is wanting ALL churches to use this form of giving to replace cash which is time consuming and expensive to count and check.

Using the QR code enables the parish to save time and money – both of which are very welcome! So please don't forget that if you normally donate cash weekly, then please use the QR codes which can be found on the back page of the newsletter each week. This helps to keep the money coming in while reducing the amount of cash that we have to count, double check and then take to the bank. And amazingly some banks have actually stopped taking cash! *Thank you and God Bless*.
