Welcome to all of our parish family and visitors to our Sunday celebration. We look forward to seeing more of our parish in the coming weeks. You are important to us and our parish is supported, especially financially, by our parishioners. We have an overdraft because our expenses exceed our income.

Please have a conversation with those in your families about the obligation to attend Mass (unless you are sick) but also to come to Jesus. Please do not walk away from him. Jesus gave His life on the cross because He loves you with a love beyond all telling.

As we move into Advent we prepare ourselves to celebrate the moment in time when God revealed himself as one of us except sin. He came among us to teach us that we are so loved by His Father even to laying down His life for you. Advent is a time for us to encounter Him in the Sacrament of confession. Please reflect on His love and Mercy for you. 'In sorrow and suffering, go straight to God with confidence, and you will be strengthened, enlightened and instructed.' (Saint John of the Cross).

The readings from the prophet Malachi, from St. Paul and the gospel of Luke, remind us of the coming of the Lord at the end of our earthly life. 'For you who fear my name, the sun of righteousness will shine out with healing in its rays'. In the Gospel of Luke Jesus reminds us when everything will be destroyed. Be careful what you hear from people, social media etc. Live your Catholic faith openly, live the truth. We have to remember that the Lord is with us, he will protect each one of us. Luke's gospel ends with the words of Jesus 'You will be hated by all people on account of my name, but not a hair of your head will be lost. Your endurance will win you your lives'. Saint Teresa of Calcutta said 'Mark this time of Advent by loving and serving others with God's own love and concern'.

May the Lord bless our families and keep us all faithful to Him.

#### IN TODAY'S GOSPEL

Traditionally November is the month the Church focuses on the four last things: death, the final judgement, heaven (and hell and purgatory), and the Second Coming - sombre subjects, to be sure, but essential and foundational to our faith. Today's reading invites us to contemplate what the signs will be of the end of the world. The Covid pandemic, the war in Ukraine and talk of a Third World War makes the end of the world seem even closer. However, the end of the world isn't necessarily a topic we give much thought to although sometimes the challenges and difficulties we face can make it seem like the end of the world! Believers and unbelievers alike acknowledge that one day the end will come - life on earth cannot be forever. Scientists suggest that our sun will burn up the earth in about five billion years, and throughout history false prophets have proclaimed with dogmatic certainty that the 'end is nigh', only to be exposed as frauds and charlatans. The truth is, no one knows the day or the hour either of our own death or the end of life on earth. What we do know, however, is that we can rely on a number of key truths. The first is that Christ lives and he has overcome death and the powers of darkness. We can also be certain that Christ is with us. In Christ the future world has already begun. The future is not darkness, confusion and fear, but by having a sure confidence that God is with us we can face it with courage and dignity.

We believe that the Lord will return — as judge and Saviour. Jesus is the good judge: we know his face, that of the Risen Christ, of Christ crucified for us. We walk and live by faith, not by sight, and even if we might rather leave the body to live with the Lord, what definitively matters is that we live lives that are pleasing to him (cf. 2 Cor. 5:7-9). Today we pray the prayer that originated on the lips of the first Christian communities in Corinth: 'Marana-tha!', which translates as, 'Our Lord, come!'(see 1 Cor. 16:22)

#### Journey Home Threshold of Hope (Continued) IN BRIEF: "PRAYER IS THE RAISING

#### OF ONE'S HEART TO GOD OR THE REQUESTING OF GOOD THINGS FROM GOD."

The evangelists have preserved two more explicit prayers offered by Christ during his public ministry.

Each begins with thanksgiving. In the first, Jesus confesses the Father, acknowledges, and blesses him because he has hidden the mysteries of the Kingdom from those who think themselves learned and has revealed them to infants the poor of the Beatitudes. His exclamation, "Yes, Father!" expresses the depth of his heart, his adherence to the Father's "good pleasure," echoing his mother's Fiat at the time of his conception and prefiguring what he will say to the Father in his agony. The whole prayer of Jesus is contained in this loving adherence of his human heart to the mystery of the will of the Father.

The second prayer, before the raising of Lazarus, is recorded by St. John. Thanksgiving precedes the event: "Father, I thank you for having heard me," which implies that the Father always hears his petitions. Jesus immediately adds: "I know that you always hear me," which implies that Jesus, on his part, constantly made such petitions. Jesus' prayer, characterized by thanksgiving, reveals to us how to ask: before the gift is given, Jesus commits himself to the One who is giving gives himself. The Giver is more precious than the gifts; he is the "treasure"; in him abides his Son's heart; the gift is given "as well." The priestly prayer of Jesus holds a unique place in the economy of salvation. A meditation on it will conclude Section One. It reveals the ever-present prayer of our High Priest and, at the same time, contains what he teaches us about prayer to our Father, which will be developed in Section Two.
