IN TODAY'S GOSPEL

The mystery of Mary's Assumption into heaven dates back to the apostles themselves. At the Council of Chalcedon in 451 AD the Roman Emperor Marcian asked the Patriarch of Jerusalem to bring the relics of Mary to Constantinople to be enshrined there. The Patriarch explained that there were no relics of Mary in Jerusalem, that 'Mary had died in the presence of the apostles; but her tomb, when opened later... was found empty and so the apostles concluded that the body was taken up into heaven.'

In the eighth century, St John Damascene preached, 'Although her body was duly buried, it did not remain in the state of death, neither was it dissolved by decay...You were transferred to your heavenly home, O Lady, Queen and Mother of God in truth.'

Mary's empty tomb on the edge of Jerusalem soon became a place of pilgrimage. The Benedictine Abbey of the Dormition stands on the spot today. The Assumption completed God's work in Mary since it wasn't fitting that the flesh that had given life to God himself should ever undergo corruption. The Assumption is God's crowning of his work as Mary ended her earthly life and entered eternity.

Today we have hope also in our own destiny. Mary was assumed, body and soul, into the glory of heaven. Our faith is rooted in the truth that we will rise bodily from the dead. Like Mary we will do so not because of our own merits - for who of us could overcome death and corruption? - but through the merits of our Lord Jesus Christ.


Today we give thanks and praise to God for Mary, our Mother and the Mother of God. Mary's complete 'Yes' to God's will opened up the grace of redemption for us all, and in the hope of eternal life and the resurrection of the body, we put all our trust, strength and confidence in God.

Our Catholic Faith from Catechism of the Catholic Church

THE SIXTH COMMANDMENT

"You shall not commit adultery."
In hrief-

'Love is the fundamental and innate vocation of every human being.'

By creating the human being man and woman God gives personal dignity equally to the one and the other. Each of them, man and woman, should acknowledge and accept his sexual identity.

Christ is the model of chastity. Every baptised person is called to lead a chaste life, each according to his particular state of life.

Chastity means the integration of sexuality within the person. It includes an apprenticeship in self-mastery.

Among the sins gravely contrary to chastity are masturbation, fornication, pornography, and homosexual practices.

The covenant which spouses have freely entered into entails faithful love. It imposes on them the obligation to keep their marriage indissoluble.

Fecundity is a good, a gift and an end of marriage. By giving life, spouses participate in God's fatherhood.

The regulation of births represents one of the aspects of responsible fatherhood and motherhood. Legitimate intentions on the part of the spouses do not justify recourse to morally unacceptable means (for example, direct sterilisation or contraception).

Adultery, divorce, polygamy, and free union are grave offenses against the dignity of marriage. To be continued next week - The Catechism of Catholic Church is available from any bookshop.


