FR GARY

The apostles say to Jesus in today's Gospel: 'Increase our faith!' It is a cry we might make our own, especially when life feels heavy or confusing.

Jesus tells us that if we had faith the size of a mustard seed, we could move mountains. In other words, faith is not about quantity but quality. A little genuine trust in God is more powerful than a great deal of self-reliance. The smallest seed of true faith can allow grace to work wonders in our lives.

We are also reminded that the Christian life is one of service. At the end of the parable, the servant recognises that his duty is simply to serve the master faithfully. In the same way, our faith expresses itself in humble service, day by day, often in unnoticed ways.

So, this Sunday we might echo the words of the apostles: 'Lord, increase our faith.' We do not ask for a grand or extraordinary faith, but for a faith that is steady, humble, and trusting. That is the kind of faith that brings peace to the heart and makes room for God to act.

Finally, I wanted to mention the possibility that we may be offered some new Stations of the Cross. It is not a guarantee, but it could be an opportunity to have some, what I think, more elegant depictions of the Way of the Cross. They are in grey marbling, with what look like white alabaster figures, and the detailing is quite striking. They are certainly well above anything we might be able to obtain for ourselves now or in the near future. The suggestion is that we would take these, and I think they would elevate our praying of the stations, and our own stations would be given a good home in one of our Catholic schools. Would you come and speak to me if you have any views on this? We would also need to approach the diocesan Art & Architecture Committee for their approval on any proposed changed.
