FROM FR GARY

There is something haunting in this parable. A man, surrounded by abundance, speaks only to himself. 'What shall I do?' he asks, 'I will build... I will store... I will say to myself...' The only voice he listens to is his own. But then, unexpectedly, another voice enters — the voice of God: 'You fool...'

This is not merely a story about wealth, but about the illusion of self-sufficiency. The rich man is not condemned for having possessions, but for imagining they could secure his soul. He builds bigger barns but never considers the poverty within. He has a full pantry and an empty heart.

Our Lord exposes the great spiritual deception of every age: that man can save himself. The fool speaks as though he owns time, as if the soul is his to command. But time is God's gift, and the soul belongs to eternity. 'This very night...' With those words, the veil is lifted, and the creature stands before his Creator.

The wisdom of the world says, "Take it easy, eat, drink, be merry." But the wisdom of God says, 'Seek ye first the Kingdom of God.' Christ does not merely warn us against greed; He beckons us to live with eternity in view.

For what are we storing up? Are we rich only in what can be lost, or are we rich in what endures? Our barns will crumble but every act of charity, every moment of prayer, every sacrifice made for love of Christ - these are treasures that no moth can destroy.

Let us live as stewards of grace, knowing that the measure of life is not found in possessions, but in the soul's likeness to God.
