Don't be put off by the title of the form being "Register a New Parishioner"! We know you are an existing parishioner but we don't have the contact details that we need, as yet. All your details will remain entirely confidential in line with current GDPR legislation. And we won't divulge your details to any third parties. The data will be held securely.

And just as important - weekly collections have slowed to a trickle, which of course is understandable given the restrictions we are all living under. It would help the church and parish enormously if you could consider making your offering by standing order, either weekly or monthly. The last few months, in addition to a reduction in Masses and attendance, has seen most of us move to a cashless society and the church is no different. Cash is always good, of course, but in these troubled times, bank transfer is so much better!

All the forms you need, Standing Order forms, Gift Aid forms (most important if you are a tax payer) and 200 Club forms are available on.... the new parish website! I hope you enjoy your visit to the site and that you are able to at least complete the parishioner registration form.

God did not only command His people to forgive, but witnessed to it. In answer to Peter's question on forgiveness, Jesus replied without limit. Not seven times but seventy times seven. St. Paul today reminds us the root of unforgiveness is selfishness., "No one lives for himself, and no one dies for oneself" says St. Paul. Forgive and you will live.

In the Lord's Prayer and in today's Gospel there are no conditions.

IN TODAY'S GOSPEL

C.S. Lewis was right on the button when he said, "Everyone says forgiveness is a lovely idea, until they have something to forgive". We pray at every Mass: "Forgive us our sins, as we forgive those who sin against us". Yet, when sinned against by a brother or sister, husband or wife, friend or foe, how ready are we to forgive? And how do we forgive? Reluctantly and resentfully, or readily, from the heart?



When Peter asked Jesus how often he should forgive, proposing the generous offer of "as many as seven times", he was really trying to set a limit – to see how few times he could forgive and get away with it! Jesus responded with a number which was not really a number! "Seventy-seven times" (or "seventy times seven") signified a countless number. Again we turn to C.S. Lewis, who explained: "We forgive, we mortify our resentment; a week later some chain of thought carries us back to the original offence and we discover the old resentment blazing away as if nothing had been done about it at all. We need to forgive our brother seventy times seven not only for 490 offences but for one offence".

As often as the sense of grievance rises hot and strong within us, Jesus challenges us to forgive. And this forgiving is not so much about forgetting as about remembering without bitterness or acrimony in our hearts. Jesus speaks in the context of relationships within the church family. The closer a relationship, the more frequently and heavily we tend to tread on one another's toes. Our deepest hurts are not usually inflicted by our worst enemy, but by our nearest and dearest, those close to us - our friends/relatives/work colleagues.

The servant in Jesus' parable owed 10,000 talents - this figure combines the largest Greek numeral with the largest unit of currency. Here is not merely a daunting debt, but one that can never be repaid. God offers us unlimited grace and inexhaustible forgiveness beyond measure, beyond our wildest dreams. But hands clenched in unforgiving anger can neither appropriate nor appreciate this gift. Forgiveness extended to a brother or sister is inextricably linked with the forgiveness received from our Heavenly Father. Jesus modelled unconditional and unlimited forgiveness as he hung on the cross, not only forgiving, but also pleading the Father's forgiveness for those who put him there.

Heavenly Father, show me that to err is only too human, but to forgive is truly to imitate the divine.

Updated Guidance For Celebration of Mass

During Mass face coverings are to be worn. Care should be taken by people in unlooping their face coverings for the reception of Holy Communion and replacing the covering afterwards. This is to prevent contamination of the covering by the hands. However, the risk is regarded as minimal providing there is no hand to hand contact between the Minister of Communion and the communicant.

The same guidance that is used for the celebration of Mass applies to all other sacraments in our churches until further notice. **It is for everyone's good that a face covering is worn.**

Collection For Holy Places

This collection will be taken up next Sunday 20 September as it was deferred from the Good Friday collection mandated by the Holy See. These funds are the main source of material support for Christian life in the Holy Land. The Franciscan custody uses the collection to carry out its important mission of preserving the Sacred Places and promoting the Christian presence through many pastoral, educational, welfare and health matters.
