As the liturgical year draws to its close, the tone of the Gospel turns to what endures when so much passes away. Jesus tells his disciples that even the Temple, the most sacred and seemingly unshakable place, will one day fall. Yet he also says, *Your endurance will win you your lives'* **Luke** 21.19

Faithfulness is not about escaping the trials of the world but meeting them with trust in God. When everything seems uncertain, Christ calls us to stand firm, to keep our hearts fixed on what lasts. The buildings, achievements, and securities of life come and go, but the love of God remains unchanging.

As we approach the end of the Church's year, let us renew our resolve to remain faithful, trusting that no effort of love is ever lost, and that in Christ, even the smallest act of perseverance becomes a seed of eternal life.
