## REFLECTION

As St Matthew tells us this Sunday, when Our Lord looked upon the crowds, 'He had compassion for them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd.' The Heart of Christ is moved by the needs of His people. He calls and sends labourers into His harvest. These words remind us that the Church is not simply an institution or a collection of buildings. She is Christ continuing His work in the world, gathering, teaching, forgiving and feeding His people. Through the Church, the compassion of Christ reaches every generation.

They also remind us that every Christian has a part to play in the Lord's harvest. Some are called to the priesthood or religious life, and we should never cease praying for vocations. But all of us are called to bear witness to Christ in the ordinary circumstances of daily life. A kind word, a patient spirit, a quiet act of charity, a faithful presence at Mass: these are all ways in which we help bring others closer to the Good Shepherd.

We live in a world where many people are anxious, lonely and searching for meaning. They too are like sheep without a shepherd. The answer is not found in programmes or passing fashions, but in Jesus Christ. He still looks upon the world with compassion, and He still sends His disciples out with the message of hope.

As we approach the summer months, perhaps we might ask ourselves some simple questions: do I pray for vocations, and am I allowing the Lord to use me in His harvest? Is there a gift that God has given, or an expertise I have developed, which could be put to the good of my community? The work is great, but the Lord Himself assures us that the harvest is plentiful. May we never be afraid to answer His call with generous hearts.
