

IN TODAY’S GOSPEL



Today begins the most important week of the Church’s year. What’s the best way to approach it? What are we meant to receive from it? How can we best participate in it? We are accustomed to celebrating the Church’s year spread over twelve months: Advent to Christmas, Christmas to Lent, Easter to Pentecost, Pentecost to the Feast of Christ the King. In the beginning, however, at the dawn of the Church’s life, the celebration of

this whole cycle was focused on one event – Easter. It was not until the fourth century that the annual liturgical cycle began to take the shape it has today.

Ask yourself: What is the purpose of these liturgical celebrations? What is the purpose of the liturgy of Palm Sunday? For sure, the Church makes a memorial of the events of our salvation, but it is so much more than an anniversary or a re-enactment. In the liturgy the once-and-for-all events of our salvation, especially the death and resurrection of Jesus, are celebrated and by the power of the Holy Spirit they are made real and present in our midst.

Jesus’ coming into Jerusalem on a donkey is made sacramentally present to us today. Zechariah prophesied that the Lord as a divine warrior would enter Jerusalem to establish his dominion, ‘from sea to sea, and from the River to the ends of the earth’. By entering Jerusalem in this way Jesus acted out his prophecy: ‘Lo, your king comes to you; triumphant and victorious is he, humble and riding on an ass, on a colt the foal of an ass’. Jesus revealed his destiny to establish the kingdom of God on earth, but his kingdom could only be established through his cross, death and resurrection. The same crowd who hailed him as he entered Jerusalem clamoured for his execution and cried out for his blood to be on them and their children.

Contemplate, if you will, the following words of St. Andrew of Crete: ‘It is ourselves that we must spread under Christ’s feet, not coats or lifeless branches or shoots of trees, matters which waste away and delight the eye only for a few hours. No, we have clothed ourselves with Christ’s grace, or with the whole of Christ – “for as many of you as were baptised into Christ have put on Christ” – so let us spread ourselves like coats under his feet’ (St. Andrew of Crete).

As we began Lent, we were asked to pray, fast, and almsgiving. I suggested during Lent you make a little sacrifice each day and put any loose change into a box in support of the Catholic Children's Society.



We welcome you all today to our Sunday Liturgy.

Today we now enter into a very important time of the Christian calendar. It is a time when we change our focus away from our material world and set our hearts on the Pascal Mystery i.e. Passion, Death and Resurrection of the Lord. Today's readings emphasise a great humility of the Son of God and his determination to fulfil the work of salvation for which he has come into this world. As from the beginning of creation,

in Jesus Christ and his humble attitude, mankind has found his way to God and has recognised in him a source of life and true glory for which he has been created. Humility and determination give to the attitude of Jesus a command to an obedient fulfilment of the will of his Father in the form as it has been described.

In the letter to the Philippians "Christ Jesus becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on the cross. Because of this, God greatly exalted him". The first reading shows triumphal entrance of Jesus to Jerusalem and the people welcoming him because they want from him the beginning of the Kingdom of God according to their earthly expectation. Very soon they would be disappointed when Jesus receives the cross on his arms, realising the true spiritual Kingdom of God the Father speaks about. The same people who welcomed him at the entrance of Jerusalem will be responsible for his way of the cross. Jesus wanted to choose the will of God to redeem a sinner world and me and you.
