FROM FR GARY

The words of Our Lord in this Sunday's Gospel are stark and sobering: 'Strive to enter by the narrow door, for many, I tell you, will seek to enter and will not be able.' (Luke 13:24)

The imagery is vivid. The door is narrow, not because God wishes to keep us out, but because the way of discipleship requires effort, honesty, and conversion of heart. It is the path of the Cross. It is not widened to suit our convenience, nor does it swing open for the lukewarm.

The original Greek word used for 'strive' (agonízesthe) implies struggle, even combat. Salvation is a gift, yes, but it is not a passive one. We must co-operate with grace just as gifts must be accepted and received. We must resist the ease of sin, the pull of comfort, and the temptation to delay our conversion.

Yet the Gospel is not a message of fear. It is a call to urgency, and above all, to hope. Though the door is narrow, it remains open, and Christ Himself stands at the threshold. The Master will welcome all who approach with humility and repentance. And indeed, He tells us that people will come from east and west, from north and south, and will recline at table in the Kingdom of God.

This is no cold exclusivity. It is the generous hospitality of heaven, but received on God's terms, not ours. As St Augustine once wrote, 'God created you without you, but He will not save you without you.'

The saints did not take salvation for granted. They examined their lives daily and walked with the humility of those who knew they were saved by mercy alone. May we do likewise.

So let us not delay. Let us begin again today, choosing the narrow path in prayer, in love, in sacrifice. For the door is open now, and our Saviour is waiting.

May God bless you this week.
