Our brand new website is up and running and has the same address as before (www.stjosephshutton.org) and contains all the information you need about the Parish, Mass Times, Parish Groups etc. etc. It's very easy to use and will help us become an interactive community, as well as a loving and caring one!

What we need you all to do now is visit the "Register a New Parishioner" section which you will find under "Parish". There is a form there that we'd like you ALL to complete. When you do this, it will help us build the Parish database, so that we can more easily contact you about Parish matters. One thing that Covid-19 has taught us is that we lacked the ability to easily and effectively inform you of important changes to Mass times, Covid-19 guidelines, registration for Masses etc. etc. Our new database will solve that in future, as long as everyone gets involved and completes the form online!

Don't be put off by the title of the form being "Register a New Parishioner"! We know you are an existing parishioner but we don't have the contact details that we need, as yet. All your details will remain entirely confidential in line with current GDPR legislation. And we won't divulge your details to any third parties. The data will be held securely.

And just as important – weekly collections have slowed to a trickle, which of course is understandable given the restrictions we are all living under. It would help the church and parish enormously if you could consider making your offering by standing order, either weekly or monthly. The last few months, in addition to a reduction in Masses and attendance, has seen most of us move to a cashless society and the church is no different. Cash is always good, of course, but in these troubled times, bank transfer is so much better!

Hello and welcome to our Sunday celebration of our Holy Mass.

We now have two Masses each weekend: on Saturday evening 6.00 at 6.00 p.m. and on Sunday at 10.30 a.m. We also have restarted our newsletters. If you know of someone who has not been able to return to our community please deliver a newsletter to them and tell them about our new website. We want to try and reach all our parishioners.

Our church is Covid secure and we are closely following the guidelines to keep you all safe. Our Blessed Lord is waiting for you. Sadly, we cannot return for weekday Masses as yet, but Mass is said in our church albeit it is locked. There are Mass intention envelopes in the Narthex should you want a Mass said for someone whom you loved or touched your life while they were with us or someone who is sick. One day we will need the prayers and Masses from those whom we knew and love in life. Please also pray the Rosary each day for all who are suffering from Covid-19 and all who have died from this horrible virus.

This Sunday we have one of the most beautiful passages of the bible. It is found in St. Paul's letter to the Philippians. Paul wants to tell us to be kind and loving, merciful to each other. We are to put the interests of others above ourselves. Then he tells us about Jesus. We should have the same attitude in life as Jesus had. He was forever God, but he did not regard this as something to be grasped. Instead He emptied Himself of His Divinity. He became a human being. More than this, He became a servant for all of us. He obeyed His Father for our sake, even when this obedience led him to his death on the cross. Jesus is a living person. We should have a personal relationship with him. We go through our days speaking to him (do we?), and listening for Him to speak to us. Again - do we? We know he is the eternal Son of the Father, the Word of God present from the beginning of creation. He is our closest friend, our deepest love. We look and hold his cross and are amazed at the extent of His Love. As St. Paul says - "Be like him". "Serve others". Stop being selfish. Look at others as more important than yourselves. This is difficult. So much of our society pressures us to think that the world revolves around our wants and us. However, it does not. The world is the Lord's. With the Grace of God, we can do the work of God.

Finally we have Holy Communion cards and gifts at the back of the church. Because of our restrictions our lovely children will be divided into two bubbles to celebrate their First Holy Communion on the last weekend of this month.

We thank our parents for being understanding and the sacrifices they are making on this special day.

Mass attendance on Saturday 12 September at 6.00 p.m. was 40.

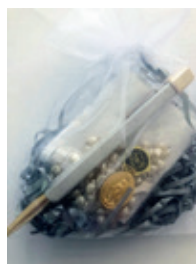
On Sunday 13 September at 10.30 a.m. attendance was also 40.

IN TODAY'S GOSPEL

Can you imagine the furore at any modern workplace if someone who had worked a full day were paid the same as someone who had only worked for the last hour of the day? With the modern raft of employment legislation and unions, there would probably be a major protest, even a riot. The boss wouldn't be able to say, as the landowner said to his protesting workers: "I am not being unfair to you, friend. Didn't you agree to work for a denarius?"



Don't worry, Jesus told the parable to elicit this very response - indignation, protest and complaint! Sometimes life just isn't fair, and neither is the gospel message – but that's the point, isn't it? The gospel message is shocking and scandalous. Why? Because in the gospel we encounter the lavish, generous and wanton giving of God's grace upon all men and women. If we haven't touched something of the "scandal of grace", then we haven't understood the "gospel of grace".

Jesus caused quite a stir through his association with so-called public sinners, including tax collectors, prostitutes and others on the margins of society. The Pharisees were indignant and horrified because they reasoned that God loves the righteous and despises the unrighteous. However, Jesus revealed that God's love shines on the righteous and the unrighteous, the good, the bad and everyone in-between. Jesus was sent by the Father to save the sinner, the poor, the outcast, those far from God, those who would never set foot in a synagogue or indeed a church! Where sin, darkness, evil and death abound, guess what: God's love and mercy super-abound!

This holier-than-thou attitude was particularly devastating in its effect in Ireland in the last century when unmarried women who fell pregnant were treated abysmally by their families and church authorities. Considered fallen women and unfit mothers, they were sent to institutions run by religious sisters, where many of them were treated brutally and harshly. Many were separated from their children and never saw them again. What priests and religious sisters failed to understand is that we are all "fallen" - we are all beggars before God's mercy. Jesus heralded a revolution of love and grace, and we are freedom fighters, activists and soldiers of this revolution.

Father. I rejoice in the gospel of your scandalous and shocking grace, and give you thanks and praise for the gift of salvation, the light of your mercy and your healing love.

Can You Help?

I hope that in your great generosity that you might be able to give a little extra to cover the cost of sanitising our church? Every time we use our church we have to clean all the benches to keep you all safe. It is a priority and it is costly as you will realise. We also need help to do this after each Mass and especially after our First Holy Communion Masses on 26 and 27 of September. Therefore we will need cleaners on Saturday afternoon to prepare for our 6.00 p.m. Mass and on Sunday after the second First Communion Mass on Sunday afternoon. The more help we can get, the better. I would be so grateful, it won't take up much of your time. ALSO we will need ushers for both First Communion Masses. Please let me know if you can help. We want every everyone to be safe.

Collection For Holy Places – today

This collection will be taken up today as it was deferred from the Good Friday collection mandated by the Holy See. These funds are the main source of material support for Christian life in the Holy Land. The Franciscan custody uses the collection to carry out its important mission of preserving the Sacred Places and promoting the Christian presence through many pastoral, educational, welfare and health matters. Please give generously.

Altar Servers

During this period we are unable to have altar servers at our Mass. However, you are not forgotten, and you are important to our parish. I will let you know as soon as possible when you will be able to serve. My thoughts are with the newly trained altar servers who have been unable to serve. You are not forgotten. The same applies to those who provide music which of course is not allowed at the moment

First Holy Communion

Sadly, due the restrictions put upon us, the First Holy Communion "celebrations" will be held over two days, at 11.00 a.m. on Saturday 26 September and 2.00 p.m. on Sunday 27 September.

The Parents Meeting, to discuss all aspects, will be held on Friday 25 September at 7.00 p.m. in the church.

Updated Guidance For Celebration of Mass

During Mass face coverings are to be worn. Care should be taken by people in unlooping their face coverings for the reception of Holy Communion and replacing the covering afterwards. This is to prevent contamination of the covering by the hands. However, the risk is regarded as minimal providing there is no hand to hand contact between the Minister of Communion and the communicant.

The same guidance that is used for the celebration of Mass applies to all other sacraments in our churches until further notice. It is for everyone's good that a face covering is worn.
