FR GARY

In this Sunday's Gospel, John the Baptist points to Jesus and says, 'Behold the Lamb of God.' We might think of lambs as cute little creatures we see in a farm but, for the people of Israel, the lamb was the creature offered in sacrifice, most especially at Passover, when its blood marked their deliverance and its flesh became the food for the journey ahead. The eating of the lamb was their 'last supper' before escaping from the slavery of Egypt.

John is telling us who Our Lord truly is. He is not merely a teacher or a prophet. He is the One who will offer himself for the life of the world. His whole mission is gathered up in that single image: the Lamb who is given.

These same words return to us at every Mass. Just before Holy Communion, the priest lifts the Sacred Host and repeats John's cry: 'Behold the Lamb of God.' We are not simply recalling something from long ago. We are being drawn into the very sacrifice of Christ. The Mass is not a new sacrifice, and it is not a different one. It is the one sacrifice of Calvary made present among us, here and now, under the humble appearances of bread and wine.

At the altar, heaven bends towards earth. Christ offers himself to the Father, and we are invited to place our own lives upon that altar with him. We all bring our own 'crosses' and place them down next to His. Our joys and labours, our sorrows, our hopes and disappointments - all can be united to his perfect offering.

To attend Mass, then, is not merely to watch or to listen. It is to take part in the self-giving love of Christ. As we hear again the words 'Behold the Lamb of God', we are reminded that we stand before a mystery of love: the Son of God who gives himself so that we might have life.

May God bless you and your families this week.
