### FR GARY

The Gospel this Sunday turns our attention to Saint Joseph. In a season often associated with Mary's 'yes', we are invited to notice Joseph's quiet obedience and steady faith. And this is a blessing for us because one of our two parishes is dedicated to St Joseph!

Joseph is faced with a situation he cannot explain and did not choose. His plans are overturned, his future suddenly uncertain. Yet the Gospel tells us that he is a just man. His goodness is shown not in fine words, but in a willingness to do what is right even when it costs him.

In the silence of a dream, God speaks. Joseph is not given a full explanation, only a simple instruction: Joseph's response is immediate and complete. He does what is asked of him.

Joseph accepts a role that is largely hidden. He does not speak a single word in the Gospel, yet his actions shape the Holy Family and protect the child who is to be called Emmanuel, God-with-us. Through Joseph's obedience, God's promise is quietly fulfilled.

As Advent comes to its close, this Gospel invites us to reflect on our own response to God's call. We may not be asked to do great things, but we are often asked to do faithful things. To trust when the path is unclear. To act with integrity when no one is watching. To allow God to work through us in ways that remain unseen.

In Joseph, we see that holiness is often found not in understanding everything, but in doing what God asks. This Advent, may we learn something of his silence, his courage, and his trust, as we prepare to welcome Christ into our lives.

The Christmas Masses have been publicised for the past few weeks. I hope the range of times means that there is a time convenient for as many of our community as possible. At the **4.30pm vigil Mass**, we are encouraging our children to come dressed as characters from the Nativity. We have had some wonderful productions put on by the school and so I know that some of the children have their costumes already! The **7pm** will be at St John's in Ingatestone with, and we hoping to have the church illuminated with candlelight, and with all the traditional carols which we will have at all the Christmas Masses. The **9.30pm** back at Hutton will be the traditional 'Midnight Mass.' In the darkness of night, we celebrate the birth of the Light of the World. In the **Mass of the Day at 1030am** we are reminded of this child's Divinity as we continue to celebrate and rejoice.

I wish you all and your loved ones a very Happy Christmas.

### Christmas Collections

Our diocese does not pay its priests a salary or pay into a pension for them. While basic living expenses are covered, priests depend to a great extent on the generosity of their parishioners. In smaller parishes like ours, a priest may claim up to just under £600 per month from parish funds as a form of stipend. Here, that amount is shared between Hutton and Ingatstone. In addition, the priest may keep what is given at the Christmas and Easter Masses. These two collections form a significant part of a priest's income. They make a real difference to his ability to set something aside for retirement, to provide for times of illness, and simply to live a balanced life, with the possibility of rest, friendship, and an occasional holiday. The Christmas collection is therefore a personal gift to your priest, and a very practical way of supporting his work and ministry. Thank you, as always, for your kindness, generosity, and continued commitment to the life of our parish.

### Christmas and Standing Orders

The diocese does not allow any donations made by standing order to be directed towards the Christmas and Easter support of clergy unless the donor has specifically requested this in writing. For that reason, those who normally give in this way may wish to consider making an additional personal gift at this time. This can be done very simply. Donations may be made using the card machine at the back of the church, by bank transfer or online donation. If using the parish bank details, please mark the reference 'Christmas'. For those more comfortable with their phone, a QR code is also available next to this notice. However, you choose to give, please know that it is very much appreciated, and received with real gratitude.
