

Welcome to our parish family and to all our visitors. It would be very encouraging to see our church full again. The Sunday celebration is an obligation for all Catholics to attend. It's our personal special time to hear the Word of God and to receive the gift of Himself in the Most Holy Eucharist - Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity. Jesus gave this gift to us on the night before He died for each one of us.

Families have the obligation to teach and bring their children to this wonderful Sacrament. The other important Sacrament is the Sacrament of Confession which we ought to go at least every four weeks to receive the grace of this Sacrament. Pope

Francis gives us four tips:-

- 1. Put the Father first. What is central, our sins or the Father who forgives everything? We need to run towards the Father's loving arms and He forgives all our sins.
- 2. Remember God's Forgiveness. After each confession, sit still for a few moments in order to remember the forgiveness you received.
- Shame is not Blame. Feeling ashamed is a good sign, but like any other sign, it points to the road we need to follow. God is never ashamed of you. He loves you in the very place where you feel ashamed. He loves you always.
 God rejoices in forgiving us, time and time again. Whenever he picks us up, he
- believes in us as if it were the first time. He is never discouraged. We are the ones that get discouraged not he.

Confession is the Sacrament of the tenderness of God, his way of embracing us. Please pray for our children and their parents as the children will make their First Communion in Lent. "Lord, make me know your ways".

May God bless our families and all those who are suffering one way or another.

Journey Home - continued

Mark's Gospel has an urgency about it. He captures the power and authority of Jesus' ministry. Today we encounter the teaching that the kingdom is not about talk but about power. Jesus came to overthrow Satan. He came to demolish the work of darkness and liberate us from its deadly grip.

Those who heard Jesus teach in the synagogue and witnessed his healing miracles knew immediately that this was a new teaching, and it came with authority. News like this is hard to contain and so it spread like wildfire! The Gospel is about transforming lives and the world. It is a force to be reckoned with – in fact, it's the greatest power in the world.

The Holy Spirit can deepen and sustain this confidence within us. As we grow in the assurance of Jesus' victory, we are led to want to praise God. Try this today, whatever circumstances or problems you face, whatever trials or trauma you are going through, praise God for his love and mercy. 'The power of praise releases the power of God into a set of circumstances and enables God to change them if this is his design' (Merlin Carothers).

Forward Planning - 1 Just to inform you that the Cathedral have organised a series of Lenten talks on the Synod that took place in Rome in October last and they have secured 4 of the participants who were present. Fr. Timothy Radcliffe OP who was the preacher and spiritual director of the whole synod; the Revd. Dr. Jam Notnik, Director of Missions for the Bishops conference and its National ecumenical officer, Mr. Austin Ivereigh, Roman Catholic Journalist, Biographer of Pope Francis. Writer, Speaker on contemporary church affairs, Bishop Nicolas Hudson, Auxiliary Bishop of Westminster (Former rector of the Ven English College in Rome), appointed delegate at the Synod this year. This will be a wonderful opportunity to learn about the Synod on Synodality and it will be open to the whole diocese.
