Hello and welcome to our Sunday Liturgy.

It was great that we could open our church on Ash Wednesday for Holy Mass and we will continue on following Sundays. It would be also great to see more of our parishioners now returning to church – "Our Father's House". Our church is safe and our stewards do a great job for the community to gather safely.

In today's gospel we see Jesus angry as he entered the Temple and watches the money changers doing their business changing money. He said "This is my Father's House, and you have turned it into a den of thieves. The Jews considered the Temple of Jerusalem the heart of their religious life. Every year during Passover crowds would gather in the Temple. Here Jesus saw people selling animals and making big profits especially from the poor. May our hearts be a worthy dwelling place for God, and may our acts of worship be authentic as we strive to deepen our relationship with God through our love and concern for one another.
