Diocesan-wide opening arrangements

Sent on behalf of Mr Michael L'Estrange, Diocesan Vicar for Administration.

1. We have been asked whether Stewards are required for a church to be open. The message from the Bishops' Conference is clear - It is important that the routines of cleanliness, stewarding and social distancing to which we have become accustomed, and which have made our churches places of real Covid security, are maintained. Therefore, we should continue to have two Stewards in the church whenever the church is open.
2. With respect to the inclusion of music and choir singing at Mass, the COVID Working Party has considered the advice set out by the Bishops' Conference (see above) and recent Government Guidance and advice publicly available from the Royal School of Church Music. All previous Government Guidance relating to numbers of singers allowed to perform during a Mass or other service has been superseded by the current National Lockdown Restrictions. The advice is clear that musicians and singers may participate in online services only if they usually form part of the service that is being broadcast and are essential to its delivery. This means that the number of people involved should be kept as small as possible in order to minimize risk and therefore the message for our Diocese is that essential music or singing should be restricted to one organist and/or a cantor.

IN TODAY'S GOSPEL

“O key of David and sceptre of Israel, you who open and nobody then can close, who close and nobody then can open: come and lead the captive from prison; free those who sit in darkness and in the shadow of death”.

Soon we will welcome the birth of Jesus not only as our Saviour but also as our King: “he will reign over the house of Jacob for ever; and of his kingdom there will be no end”. Jesus is truly a king. The wise men from the East asked: “Where is he who has been born king of the Jews? For we have seen his star in the East and have come to worship him”. Recognizing his kingship, Pilate fastened a notice to Jesus’ cross which read: “Jesus of Nazareth, the King of the Jews”.

Jesus was born to deliver us from the dominion of darkness and to transfer us into the kingdom of light. He inaugurated the kingdom of God: “Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand”. Using many parables he teaches us about the kingdom of God.

He insists that only the docile and humble can receive the kingdom: “unless you turn and become like little children you will not enter the kingdom of heaven”. He promises that those who practise and teach his commands will be great in the kingdom.

How shall we prepare ourselves to welcome Jesus as our King this Christmas? A king can only rule when the people give him authority to reign over them. Jesus will be our king only if we invite him to rule over us by placing our whole lives under him, leaving no area of our lives outside his kingship and holding nothing back from him. We must make the decision to follow him, obey him and serve him with all of our hearts. Do you want Jesus to reign in your life? What areas of your life do you wish to place under his kingship? Use these precious days before Christmas to ask the Holy Spirit to show you any areas that you need to place under his rule. Jesus is coming. Welcome him with great joy! Jesus longs to be your king. Invite him to reign over your life!

Jesus, you were born to be my Saviour and my King. I invite you to be my King and to rule over my whole life.
