FR GARY

Have you ever wondered why Our Lord was baptised? People came to John the Baptist seeking baptism as a sign of their repentance and the forgiveness of their sins. We also know that Our Lord was without sin and the Eternal Son of the Father. Why did He do it? The question seems to have confused John the Baptist as well. He has a strong sense that this is not the way that things should be. Our Lord, however, is insistent. It is a sign of His loving commitment to humanity that He took on all that it means to be human. This is the first reason. Christ submitting to baptism by John is a sign of His solidarity with sinful humanity.

More than that, however, is that we know that Christian baptism is greater than John's baptism even as Our Lord Himself is greater than John the Baptist. Our baptism not only forgives sins. It makes us members of the Church. It makes us adopted sons and daughters of God. It infuses the very life of God into our soul, and this is what makes us God's children. The origin of this is Our Lord's own baptism. We need to be cleansed in the waters of baptism. This is why one of the most precious things parents can do for their children is to bring them forward to be baptised. We are sanctified in the waters of baptism. Our Lord sanctified those waters by his own baptism.

We pray this Sunday for all the families in our parish, especially our young people. I am always pleased to hear from parents who would like to have their child baptised. Do get in touch any time.

Epiphany Chalk Blessing

The Epiphany chalk blessing is a simple way of echoing that moment in our own lives. With blessed chalk, a prayer is written on the doorway of the home, asking that Christ may bless all who enter and all who live there. The letters recall both the Wise Men and the ancient prayer *Christus Mansionem Benedicat* 'May Christ bless this dwelling.' It is a quiet and humble custom. The chalk can fade, be smudged, or washed away by time and weather, but the prayer it represents remains. It reminds us that faith is lived out day by day, in kitchens and drawing rooms, in family life, hospitality, patience and forgiveness. Each time we pass through our own front door, the chalk blessing gently recalls who we are and whom we belong to. Like the Magi, we have encountered Christ, and now we ask that He may remain with us, guiding our homes by His light throughout the year ahead.
