


IN TODAY'S GOSPEL

The Holy Spirit led Jesus into the desert for forty days to be tempted and tested. During Lent we too are led by the Spirit into the mystery of Jesus' sojourn in the desert. 'By the solemn forty days of Lent the Church unites herself each year to the mystery of Jesus in the desert'. Lent, then, is a journey into the desert. We too, during this holy season, can expect to be tempted and tested.

The name Satan means 'adversary'. In the book of Job, we are given a vivid picture of Satan in God's heavenly court, along with all the other angels, where he has the role of accuser or prosecutor. The Scriptures identify Satan as the serpent in the Garden of Eden who tempted Adam and Eve and, therefore, as the origin of sin and temptation. What the Scriptures and tradition make known is that humankind has a mortal enemy who, although a finite being created by God, is in a desperate struggle to overthrow God's reign, usurp his Lordship and lead his creation into darkness and death. On Easter Sunday each of us will recite our baptismal promises and in doing so renew them. Bear this in mind as we move through Lent because, as you will be aware, a renewal of our baptismal promises involves us actively, freely and voluntarily rejecting Satan.

Lent is also a time for us to discover anew and afresh the gospel, the Good News which Jesus began to proclaim immediately after his time of testing. What is the Good News? The Good News is a message of two parts: the first part is to repent and the second part to believe in the gospel. We walk together on this road marked out for us by the Church and take up our call to stand firm and resist the devil, knowing that he will flee, and embrace freely and with love the gospel, which is Christ with us and in us, the hope of salvation.

Welcome to all our parishioners today on the First Sunday of Lent. The passage from the gospel marks the start of the ministry of Jesus. Jesus is lead into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil. Jesus identifies with humanity by being tempted but decisively rejects the devil. Mathew portrays this battle with the devil through the use of scriptural texts.

We today accompany our Lord into the Lenten desert of the wilderness of life and do battle everyday with the devil. The weapons the devil uses is first pleasure, gluttony and

materialism. The second is power and fame and boasting. The third is pride, vanity and idolatry. The devil tempts us to turn to self. Jesus invites us to turn to God. All temptations come to us under the guise of some kind of goodness. No sane person chooses the evil unless some positive benefit is seen to come from it.

During the season of Lent let us look at our lives, the good things that we do for love of Jesus and the bad choices we make by surrendering ourselves to the devil. We find peace in life by following Jesus. On the other hand, by choosing the devil we find unhappiness. Then we are confronted with being humble by coming to Jesus in the Sacrament of Confession or by being proud and afraid to approach Jesus. Jesus was tempted. We are tempted. Jesus did not give in to the wiles of the devil. We sadly do so often. Let this lent be a positive sign of conversion in our life. Let us come to Jesus and say "Lord be merciful to me, a sinner".

The Sacrament of Confession is available at St. Joseph's on three separate occasions: on Saturday mornings, before Mass; on a Saturday evening before Mass; or on request. You are free, of course, to go to any church. However, remember there is a Reconciliation Service in the Cathedral during Lent where several priests will be available.

We ask the blessed Virgin Mary to help us and walk with us through this Lenten season and bring us to Easter with mind and heart renewed.

I wish you all a very happy Sunday. May it truly be a day of rest for you all.


Parish Expenditure
