Welcome to everyone today as we enter the Holy Season of Advent. Please do not let the frenetic Christmas shopping get in the way of your personal spiritual preparation on the real meaning of Christmas, namely the birth of our redeemer and saviour. Advent conjures up Hope, Love, Joy and Peace. Whilst advent is about the birth of Jesus and the 'Parousia' as the returning of the Master Jesus, both implications are drawn from the Advent celebrations, and even more importantly, the daily coming of Jesus into our lives.

The first reading and the psalm invites us come to the mountain of the Lord, whilst the gospel speaks of the the Son of Man on the last day. The mountain signifies a place of worship for Israel, all nations of the world are involved. However in the Gospel reading, Jesus gives us the urgent warning to be prepared and stay awake, lest his coming catches us unaware like the coming of the flood in the days of Noah. There is a urgent air of preparation during the advent season, as many people work harder to be set for the Christmas celebration. There is an increase in the wave of corruption, cheating, stealing etc. in the mad craving to make material advancement. The warning of Jesus today is meant to save someone. The one to be saved is the one who agrees to be prepared i.e. ready in good works. Therefore the period of Advent should be a period of good works and not of evil. It should be a period of peace not of quarrels. Let these be our guiding principles in this season of Advent. May God find us ready and waiting at all times, in his daily encounter with us in his Word and Sacrament and at his second coming.

IN TODAY'S GOSPEL

Advent is a season of light: a time when the light of Christ shines forth into our lives and on to our world, and we receive a great gift: "to us a child is born, to us a son is given". In John's Gospel, Jesus says, "I have come as light into the world, that whoever believes in me may not remain in darkness".

Advent has its roots in the pagan festival of the winter solstice. The word 'solstice' is derived from the Latin sol (sun) and sistere (to stand still). The pagan world hungered for light and worshipped the sun god Sol Invictus, who was invoked each day at sunrise. As bright and as powerful as the sun is, we know it cannot cast its light on the greatest mysteries of our existence or penetrate the darkness of sin and death. For this a brighter, more radiant light is required. The prophet Isaiah declared hundreds of years before the birth of Christ: "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who dwelt in a land of deep darkness, on them has light shined". Advent, then, is an opportunity for us to come into this light, see with the light of Christ and walk our pilgrim way such that we let our light shine.

"Advent" literally means "coming", and the Church has always sought to remind us during this holy season of the three comings of Christ: his first at his birth, his second at his return to earth in glory, and his third when he comes into each of our lives. The work of the Spirit in our lives is twofold: he compels us to confess that Jesus Christ is Lord to the glory of the Father, and he also moves us to pray with heartfelt longing, "Come, Lord Jesus, come". Jesus is the meaning of Christmas. He is the meaning of human existence. The baby born in the stable, in poverty and helplessness as God made man, is our light and hope. We lift up our hearts in praise and thanksgiving for Jesus who is the Light of the World, the light which darkness could not extinguish or overcome.

Lord Jesus, in this Advent season we invite your light into our lives and come ourselves into the light so that by the grace of repentance and a deeper conversion we may walk as children of the light.

Advent And Christmas Season

Please pray for and support your priest during the very busy Advent and Christmas season. It is this particular time of year which becomes very busy for our priests. We help with confessions and Masses in our parishes and schools around the deanery. Visiting the sick at home and in care homes, during the week and also weekends, means your priests are very busy, especially when you add in the Masses and Baptisms, which of course are the life and heartbeat of our parishes.

Can you help? It would be good if you could accept responsibility to support and encourage our young people to come to Mass and remain involved in the community. We need to have ways to understand young people and what they are looking for in church. It would be a great help if you could look out for new parishioners and make them welcome. Also, by helping elderly and disabled people get to Mass would be a good initiative. Every two weeks on a Friday we have a Friendship Club - maybe you could tell people about it, and offer to help to bring people to it and take them home afterwards?

Sacramental follow-up? Baptism - sending parents a card on the anniversary of baptisms. Funerals - those attending are often moved by being in church. Is there some way we can keep them involved with us?

We need catechists, musicians, singers, readers, Eucharistic Ministers, church cleaners etc. etc. The outside of the church and the church hall doesn't look after itself - we need help! We also need youth leaders.

There are many other ways we can help including updating our parish census forms. All of this can only be done if we pray at home and visit our churches, attending the Sunday Mass and weekday Mass when we can. Helping afterwards with teas and refreshments and encouraging parishioners to spend time with one another would also be very beneficial. I am sure there are many other ways to build our church community and these are just a few immediate thoughts. I would be pleased to hear from anyone who would like to get involved.
