

IN TODAY'S GOSPEL



Today is truly a day to celebrate. St Leo the Great, fearful that anyone would give way to sadness or grief on this most holy of days, said, 'Our Saviour... is born today. Let us rejoice. It is unlawful to be sad today for this is the birthday of life. This life brings happiness of a promised eternity to us since the fear of death has been destroyed. Let the holy exult because they are coming near to their prize. Let the sinners rejoice because they are invited to grace. Let pagans be encouraged because they too are summoned to life.' The Christian faith is often wrongly understood to be all about what we do for God: our prayers, our works, our strivings, our holiness. We can sometimes even think that we will be saved or get

to heaven because of who we are or what we've done for God. If that were true, there wouldn't be much cause for celebration, because what Christmas Day makes clear and unveils is that the Christian faith is all about what God has done for us.

What has God done for us? He became one of us to make us partakers in the divine nature: he has raised us up: he has reconciled us to him as the Father; he has opened up heaven again and restored what was lost through the tragedy of Original Sin and the Fall of the human race. The wonder of God becoming man is that Jesus the eternal Word has brought to the eyes of faith a new and radiant vision of God's glory. In Jesus of Nazareth God is made visible.

Today, the Holy Spirit will fill our hearts with joy as we recognize in Christ the revelation of the Father's love. Today God is seen as one like us. Christ, the Son before all ages, is now born in time. He came to lift up all things to himself and to restore unity, leading us from exile on earth into our heavenly home.

Today, the Word who sits on the throne of glory with the Father became flesh, born of the Holy Virgin, giving the universe the grace and hope of adoption into the fullness of becoming God's children.

- Please note there are plenty of space during the week for mass to be said for your intentions or deceased members of your family or for the Holy Souls in purgatory.


PLEASE NOTE: Any Mass intentions have to be in a week in advance as our newsletter is printed a week in advance.

Journey Home Threshold of Hope (Continued)

IN BRIEF: "PRAYER IS THE RAISING OF ONE'S HEART TO GOD OR THE REQUESTING OF GOOD THINGS FROM GOD'

THE SACRAMENTS OF SALVATION

The church affirms that for believers the sacraments of the New Covenant are necessary for salvation. 'Sacramental grace' is the grace of the Holy Spirit, given by Christ and proper to each sacrament The Spirit heals and transforms those who receive him by confirming them to the Son of God. The fruit of the sacramental life is that the Spirit of adoption makes the faithful partakers in the divine nature by uniting them in a living union with the only Son, the Saviour.

THE SACRAMENTS OF ETERNAL LIFE

The church celebrates the mystery of her Lord 'until he comes,' when God will be 'everything to everyone.' Since the apostolic age the liturgy has been drawn toward its goal by the Spirit's groaning in the Church: Marana tha! The liturgy thus shares in Jesus' desire: 'I have earnestly desired to eat this Passover with you... until it is fulfilled in the kingdom of God.' In the sacraments of Christ the Church already receives the guarantee of her inheritance and even now shares in everlasting life, while 'awaiting our blessed hope, the appearing of the glory of our great God and Saviour Christ Jesus.' The 'Spirit and the Bride say, 'Come... Come, Lord Jesus!"

SYNODAL Pathway Progress

We invite you to reflect on the Synodal Pathway. Pope Francis has extended Synod on Synodality to 2024. He made this decision "in order to have a more relaxed period of discernment". He would like everyone to live it as the journey of brothers and sisters who proclaim the joy of the Gospel.

The first was the worldwide undertaking during which Catholics were encouraged to submit feedback to their local dioceses - these have now gone to Rome. The continental share discussion will be with the Synod of Bishops. The final universal phase will begin at the General Assembly of Synod of Bishops October 2023 to October 2024.

In the meantime, we need to reflect on Eucharistic revival and how we develop and some of reverence and awe in our celebration of the Eucharist and live our Catholic values in today's world.
