## Hello and welcome to our Most Holy Mass.

It is encouraging to see more people returning to our Sunday Mass. We want those who are shielding to know that you are remembered in our Holy Mass each week. Next Sunday is Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord. Palm branches will be given to you as you leave church. I pray that more parishioners will return to Mass in order to celebrate the Pascal mysteries.

Our church is safe. We remind you to wear masks if you are returning after a long time. Now is the time to add your sacrifices to those of the Lord who gave His life for you. Because of COVID, Confessions are available on request.

In the readings the themes of suffering, surrender, and dying are repeated as we approach Holy Week. Jesus' prayer in today's gospel is known as the "Johannine Gethsemane" since the tone is reminiscent of the Gethsemane episode "Now my soul is troubled. What shall I say: Father save me from this hour? But it was for this very reason that I have come to this hour. Father glorify your name". Jesus had understood the mystery of the wheat grain and was ready to surrender.

In today's readings we have the level of surrender and death (unless a grain of wheat...). Then there is the struggle with sin. However, both surrender and death bring about salvation. We can ask ourselves, are we ready for struggle and for surrender so that my life becomes salvific?

Each day we die to sin and evil and rise to peace and joy. Let us each day pray especially the Rosary. As we go about our daily activities let us say Jesus, Jesus and put God first in our lives. Jesus' mercy should be on our lips. Lord God our light and salvation, we praise you for your gifts of life and our faith. Help us to walk in your ways and meet you in prayer and to talk about you to others especially in our families and encourage them to be faithful to your Word and Sacrament. Give us faithfulness in this present life so that we may come to know your beauty with our brothers and sisters in the life to come. May we all have a good Holy Week and come to the feast of Easter with renewed hearts.
