IN TODAY'S GOSPEL

We all know the Sermon on the Mount, which Luke calls the Sermon on the Plain, but we may not be as familiar with the Sermon from the Boat! We don't know what Jesus taught on this occasion, but when he had finished, he gave instructions to seasoned fishermen to cast their nets. Jesus intruded into Peter's sphere of influence, so to speak: he was, after all, a fisherman by trade, and he and his fellow disciples had been fishing all night but caught nothing. How dispiriting and exhausting this must have been!

Peter was a reluctant fisherman on this occasion. Obeying Jesus was against his better judgement: everything he understood about fishing screamed that they didn't stand a cat's chance in hell of catching even one fish! How wrong he was – for the catch was overwhelming, overflowing and almost sank the boat! Clearly Peter was staggered, shocked and humbled, and his response reflects a sober appraisal of his own thinking: "Depart from me, for I am a sinful man, O Lord". Jesus doesn't let Peter or the other disciples, who are clearly beyond astonished, wallow too much in their own sinfulness/ weakness because they have work to do – from now on they will be catching men. In short, their task is to be joy-filled evangelists, missionary disciples.

Historically, we tend to think of the work of evangelizing as the preserve of 'professional religious' (the clergy, religious or lay people employed in this capacity). It is not true, for we are all called to be missionary disciples and win others for Christ. We don't do so with loud acclaim or ecclesial recognition or job title but because it is only natural to want to share the joy of the gospel.

St. Pope John Paul II vividly described this reality: The eyes of faith behold a wonderful scene: that of a countless number of lay people, both women and men, busy at work in their daily life and activity, oftentimes far from view and quite unacclaimed by the world, unknown to the world's great personages but nonetheless looked upon in love by the Father, untiring labourers who work in the Lord's vineyard. Confident and steadfast through the power of God's grace, these are the humble yet great builders of the Kingdom of God in history'.

Lord, give me the courage to put out into the deep and be a joy-filled, missionary disciple.

Pope's Visit to the Arabian Peninsula

Fresh from saying Mass in Panama for World Youth Day, Pope Francis became the first pontiff to visit the Arabian Peninsula, the birthplace of Islam, as he arrived last Sunday in the United Arab Emirates on a trip seeking to improve relations with the Muslim world and to offer encouragement to Catholic migrants amid increasing persecution and bloodshed. The Emirates is a relatively tolerant oasis that is home to some one million Catholics.

World Day of Prayer for the Sick 2019

February 11 is World Day of Prayer for the Sick, an observation started by Pope John Paul II as a way for believers to offer prayers for those suffering from illnesses. The day coincides with the commemoration of Our Lady of Lourdes.

Pope John Paul II initiated the day in 1992 to encourage people to pray for those who suffer from illness and for their caregivers. The Pope himself had been diagnosed with Parkinson's a year before, in 1991. Pope Benedict XVI also declared his decision to resign from his post as the Pope on this day in 2013. He cited his failing health as the reason behind his decision.

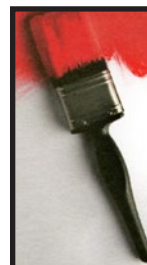
