

"There was a rich man who dressed in purple garments and fine linen and dined sumptuously each day. And lying at his door was a poor man named Lazarus, covered with sores, who would gladly have eaten his fill of the scraps that fell from the rich man's table."

IN TODAY'S GOSPEL

The Old Testament understands wealth as a blessing from God, a sign of divine generosity. It was something good, to be received with thanksgiving. Nevertheless, the prophets also taught that having wealth carried obligations. It was essential that the wealthy recognized the source of their blessings and imitated divine generosity.

The rich man in today's parable had failed to acknowledge the source of his blessings and hadn't imitated the divine generosity towards him by sharing with those in need. He was oblivious to Lazarus' needs, who 'longed to satisfy his hunger with what fell from the rich man's table' (v.21), and never comforted him by satisfying this hunger. Keeping all the good things for himself, the rich man refused to share them and had singularly failed to listen to the prophets.

"'The poor you will always have with you" (Mk 14:7). This is a summons never to lose sight of every opportunity to do good. Behind it, we can glimpse the ancient biblical command: "If one of your brothers and sisters... is in need, you shall not harden your heart nor close your hand to them in their need. Instead, you shall open your hand to them and freely lend them enough to meet their need... When you give to them, give freely and not with ill will; for the Lord, your God, will bless you for this in all your works and undertakings. For the needy will never be lacking in the land..." (Dent 15:7-8. 10-11). In a similar vein, the Apostle Paul urged the Christians of his communities to come to the aid of the poor of the first community of Jerusalem and to do so "without sadness or compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver" (2 Cor 9:7). It is not a question of easing our conscience by giving alms, but of opposing the culture of indifference and injustice we have created with regard to the poor.' (Message on Fifth World Day of the Poor). Lord, may I see giving to the poor and needy not as generosity, but as giving back to them what belongs to them: the rights and dignity that we take for granted.

In brief:

"Where your treasure is, there will your heart be also'

The tenth commandment forbids avarice arising from a passion for riches and their attendant power.

Envy is sadness at the sight of another's goods and the immoderate desire to have them for one-self. It is a capital sin.

The baptised person combats envy through good-will, humility, and abandonment to the providence of God.

Christ's faithful "have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires." They are led by the spirit and follow hid desires.

Detachment from riches is necessary for entering the Kingdom of heaven. "Blessed are the poor in spirit."

"I want to see God" expresses the true desire of man. Thirst for God is quenched by the water of eternal life.
