



IN TODAY'S GOSPEL

But know this: if the owner of the house had known at what hour the thief was coming, he would not have let his house be broken into. You also must be ready, because the Son of Man is coming at an unexpected hour'. Astonishingly, Jesus compares himself to a thief who unpredictably burgles a house. In this and other ways, Jesus teaches that he will return, and that his return will always be a surprise. Yet it mustn't catch us unawares: 'Be dressed ready for service and keep your lamps burning'.

Our lives of faith can become flat and lack any sense of excitement or urgency. What can inspire us? We need an element of tension to move us from apathy to zeal. God gives us the spur we need: Jesus' return. He will return - and when we least expect it! To create that sense of anticipation and tension we must reject all unbelief that would convince us that whilst the Lord may be coming back, it will certainly not be in our lifetime.

Such an assumption sets itself against Jesus' own words. It's also foolish, for his return could occur as soon as tomorrow. We may be afraid, and, to avoid dealing with our fears, put the idea of the Second Coming out of our minds. Yet we need to face up to the question: will we be ready and watching when he does come? Recognizing this urgent need, Pope St John Paul II exhorted, 'Christians are called to renew their hope in the definitive coming of the kingdom of God, preparing for it daily in their hearts, in the Christian community to which they belong, in their particular social context and in world history itself'. The surest way to prepare our hearts for the Second Coming is to ask the Holy Spirit to give us a hunger, thirst and longing for it. *Holy Spirit, awaken my heart! Give me an eager, expectant faith that Christ is coming back... Set my heart on fire with such love for Jesus that I long to see him return*.

Welcome to our parish family and to all visitors for our Sunday celebration of the Eucharist.

I would like to draw your attention to one or two points of information. We have only two Masses over the weekend. The attendance at these two Masses hovers around 100 approximately. Therefore when you request a Mass Intention, normally parishioners ask for weekends. I have a duty as all priests have that one Mass has to be said for Our Parishioners. So at present, with the above in mind, I am booked up to October for weekend intentions. If you request an intention at the weekend, the Mass

intention may have to be said at one of our weekday Masses. Those times are printed in the newsletter. I am sure you will understand the situation.

Secondly, I ask you to take home with you your newsletter and not leave it behind in the church. The newsletter takes up considerable time to gather information for you to read. It is also printed for us and paper supplied free of charge by one of our parishioners who has done this for many years. Please do keep that in mind. Also please do not read your newsletter before Mass. When we come into the church, we should recollect our thoughts on what we are about to celebrate and speak to Jesus asking the Holy Spirit to come upon us. It could be your last Mass. We are reminded in the scriptures 'that we do not know the day or the hour of our death'.

Thirdly I have made a summary of the Ten Commandments for your information. I would urge you to purchase a copy of 'Catechism of the Catholic Church' so that you may learn and understand the teaching of your faith and it will help you to have that conversation in your families. For example, to miss Mass on Sunday Is a serious sin unless you are sick or housebound. If you choose not to go to mass on Sunday, you need to go to confession before you go to Holy Communion. The same goes for the other Commandments given to us by God. If you need any clarification or questions, please speak with your priest. You can go to any church of your choosing for the Sacrament of confession.

In today's Gospel, Jesus told two short stories to emphasise the importance of selfpreparedness for 'You must stand ready, because the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect'. Complacency is one of the enemies of our spiritual progress and it can be a serious temptation. For all our care and precautions, there is absolutely no way we can know when or how Jesus will come to call us to himself. But we have the promise from our Saviour that one day He will be coming back for us, like either the Master returning from a wedding feast or like the thief in the middle of the night when we least expect Him.

I wish you all a happy weekend and May God bless you all and our families.

Journey Home – Threshold Of Hope Our Catholic Faith from Catechism of the Catholic Church THE FIFTH COMMANDMENT

"You shall not kill."

In brief:

'On God's hand is the life of every living thing and the breath of all mankind' (Job 12:10). Every human life, from the moment of conception until death, is sacred because the human person has been willed for its own sake in the image and likeness of the living and holy God.

The murder of a human being is gravely contrary to the dignity of the person and the holiness of the creator.

The prohibition of murder does not abrogate the right to render an unjust aggressor unable to inflict harm. Legitimate defense is a grave duty for whoever is responsible for the lives of others or the common good.

From its conception, the child has the right to life. Direct abortion, that is abortion willed as an end or as a means, is a criminal practice, gravely contrary to the moral law. The church imposes the canonical penalty of excommunication for this crime against human life.

Because it should be treated as a person from conception, the embryo must be defended in its integrity, cared for, and healed like every other human being.

Intentional euthanasia, whatever its forms or motives, is murder. It is gravely contrary to the dignity of human person and to the respect due to the living God, his creator. Suicide is seriously contrary to justice, hope and charity. It is forbidden by the fifth commandment.

Scandal is a grave offense when by deed or omission it deliberately leads others to sin. Because of the evils and injustices that all war brings with it, we must do everything reasonable possible to avoid it. The church prays 'From famine, pestilence and war, O Lord, deliver us.'

The church and human reason assert the permanent validity of the moral law during armed conflicts. Practices deliberately contrary to the law of nations and to its universal principles are crimes.

'The arms race is one of the greatest curses on the human race and the harm it inflicts on the poor is more than can be endured' (GS 81:3).

'Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called Sons of God' (Mt 5:9).
