Some months later he decided to visit his home town since he was in that area. He was invited to speak in the synagogue. Jesus took up the offer and began to read to them and teach them. They had two feelings. Firstly, how did this young man who was a carpenter's son get all this wisdom. Secondly, it seemed that we was touching their hearts. He was going to make demands on

them which made them doubt about Jesus. Because of this we are told that he could not perform any miracles but did a few healings. He went off to another place. He had come to tell them that they had to change their way of life. He had come that they may change their way of life and become like him, because he is the Son of God. They must open their hearts to his message and change their old ways.

Jesus' message was that He had come that they may have life and have it to the full. "I have come that you may imitate me.
