## BLESSED THE PEOPLE THE LORD HAS CHOSEN TO BE HIS OWN



Hello and welcome to all our parish family. It is great to see you returning to our Sunday Liturgy. Our parish community needs you and you need Jesus in the Most Holy Eucharist. Our church is open from 10.00 till 4.00 p.m. for you to visit the Blessed Sacrament. Now that we have more freedom to move about, don't forget Jesus. Sunday is always a special day. It should be different from other days of the week.

Today's feast of the Most Holy Trinity speaks to us that God shows Himself to us through the three persons of the Holy Trinity. God the Father, Jesus His Son, and the Holy Spirit. Today we thank God for our families and for this time we spend in prayer. Jesus was sending the disciples out to preach to all the nations, teaching people to keep God's commandments and living as Jesus taught them. We are baptised disciples of Jesus. Importantly Jesus promised the disciples (and us) to be with them to the end of time. The sign of the cross is an important prayer. God the Father created the world and everything in it. God the Son is Jesus who came to us and died on the cross for all of us. God the Holy Spirit is not visible, but is with us always to strengthen us on our journey of life until we reach our true home.

Finally let us pray the rosary for an end to this pandemic and other intentions as a family or individually each day. Remember also to have a Mass said for anyone in your family who has died or may be sick. We all need prayers. Mass intention envelopes are at the back of the church. Just write down your intention, explaining whether they have died (RIP) or sick, and enclose your donation. The family of a sick person or a bereaved family would be strengthened by your thoughtfulness. It is so easy to forget all the good you can do by this act of kindness and the power of the Holy Mass. The Bishops of England and Wales issued a key statement on Environmental issues last week, and you may be wondering what the Diocese of Brentwood is doing on this matter. This therefore seems a fitting moment to share with you some work that has been going on in the Diocese over the last few months, and to ask for your prayers.

1. There is a group working on Environmental commitments and actions across the Diocese
2. The work is going well, and drafts will be ready for Deaneries and others to consider in late June/July
3. The resources for parishes will be rooted in our Catholic faith, with prayerful resources as well as calls to commitment and action
4. Please keep the weekend of 2/3 October free from other parish appeals/commitments, if possible, so that it can be a launch weekend for this key aspect of living faith, at a time when climate change is a global emergency.

Masses will be celebrated by the Bishop at 11 a.m. Each of these masses will include the sacrament of Anointing of the Sick, and will conclude with the Angelus at 12 noon, followed by refreshments in the parish hall.
