

### IN TODAY'S GOSPEL

Have you ever felt faintly disappointed by today's Gospel reading? After all the rich glories of the last three days, today's Gospel seems to be a little flat. It presents only half the story - the stone rolled away and the tomb empty - and it emphasizes simply Jesus' absence rather than his glorious Risen presence.

Easter Sunday is a joyful, celebratory day but not one on which we can rest on our laurels -or even Jesus' laurels! Faith in the resurrection invites us to ponder and reflect; how can an empty tomb be a sign of the resurrection? The answer lies in John's understanding of 'signs' in Jesus' life. For him. Jesus is a wonderful mystery, a revelation of God himself and the mystery of his great plan of salvation.

Mysteries can be entered into and experienced by putting faith in the signs. Throughout the Gospels these signs give us some revelation of the mystery of Jesus. Here at the end of the Gospel the signs of the stone rolled away, the empty tomb and the folded linen cloths - signs that can be clearly seen - serve to give us entrance into the mystery of the resurrection. We're standing on the threshold of something wonderful and amazing, something that draws us to faith.

As we see and believe the signs we're drawn into glimpsing and experiencing a further revelation of the mystery. In today's Gospel the disciple expresses only the beginnings of faith. The signs have opened the doorway of a great mystery to him. The climax is the realization that Jesus is alive and is the Lord (John 20:7-8). This insight is so precious for us because it corresponds to our own experience. Full Easter faith is something we progress or grow into, as did the disciples.

Today, for those who are willing to believe, there's an excellent opportunity to be in contact with the Risen presence of our Saviour. We can share in his life, convinced that the power of sin has been broken in our lives and that we also have become a new creation with him.

'Hallelujah! Christ is risen from the dead! Dying, he conquered death; To the dead, he has given life.' (The Byzantine Liturgy)

# **Ministries**


Church Cleaners - We are desperately in need of cleaners to clean God's House. We gather on Thursday at 10.00 a.m. -11.00 a.m. Please Help.

Welcome to all our parish family and visitors on this Easter

Today's feast of the Resurrection of the Lord is that we are here because Jesus not only overcame death, not only rose from the dead, but is with us. He has come to stay with us as he promised. 'For a short time you will feel desperate,' he told his disciples. 'But I shall come again, and I shall be with you all days, even to the end of the world'. Jesus is here and now with us. It is the presence of Jesus, that he is with

us, that makes us what we are and fills the scriptures. It is he that we choose to be with, to share our lives with us, to be with us every moment of those lives. # Threshold of Hope - Preparation before Mass.


A personal encounter with the crucified and risen Lord, in the celebration of the Mass is not simply a private affair. This meeting always takes place as part of the action of the whole church including the angels, the martyrs and all the Saints. To take our place amongst this great company and to receive the grace of Holy Communion, should involve some preparation, in order that we can abandon ourselves more completely to the saving mysteries that we celebrate. To that end I would appreciate if we could come to our sacred celebration with a deep sense of reverence. I ask in particular that all ministers of word and sacrament not to wear shorts even if you're not ministering (in case you are asked). Remember "This is the bread which comes down from heaven, so that one may eat of it and not die. I am the living bread which came down from heaven. Whoever eats of this bread will live forever, and the bread that I will give for the life of the Lord is my flesh (John 6:50-51)". Every truth, every hope, healing and consolation are to be found in these words of Christ. They are why, for over 2000 years, Catholics have faithfully obeyed Christ's command at the Last Supper, "Do this in memory of me."

### Situation in Ukraine



### **QR Codes**

## What are they and how do they work?

A QR (Quick Response) code works in the same way as a barcode at the supermarket. It is a machine-scannable image that can instantly be read using a Smartphone camera. Every QR code consists of a number of black squares and dots which represent certain pieces of information. In our instance, the QR code will take you directly to a website where you can make your donation digitally, instead of using cash. The Diocese is wanting ALL churches to use this form of giving to replace cash which is time consuming and expensive to count and check.

Using the QR code enables the parish to save time and money - both of which are very welcome! So please don't forget that if you normally donate cash weekly, then please use the QR codes which can be found on the back page of the newsletter each week. This helps to keep the money coming in while reducing the amount of cash that we have to count, double check and then take to the bank. And amazingly some banks have actually stopped taking cash!
