

The Feast of the Most Holy trinity



Welcome to our parish Sunday liturgy and to all our parishioners and visitors.

Today I want to draw your attention to the growing habit of parishioners coming into our Sunday Mass either on the time the Mass starts or after the Penitential Rite. There are also quite a lot of raised voices. Please remember to come early so that you can quietly prepare and show reverence to Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. Would you go to a dinner party when

all the guests have begun to eat? At Mass we are entering into the celebration of the Pascal Mystery of the Death and Resurrection of the Lord.

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Most Holy Trinity. The first reading gives us the theology of Jesus, the second reading from Paul to the Romans gives us the beginning of the theology of the Holy Spirit. "God 's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us" Paul says. The Spirit is God's love poured out to us in a sense. "This love gives us peace, hope in salvation, overcoming of our sufferings, endurance of all things, and hope in God. It is God's way of taking care of us now that we have been saved by Jesus.

When we think of the Spirit which we have received in baptism and which was strengthened in us by confirmation, we should realise that it is God's great awesome love protecting us, encouraging us, and teaching us the right way. In the Gospel is the clear expression of the theology of the Trinity that we have in the Bible. Jesus is explaining to the Apostles that he and the Creator God are one. "All that the Father has is mine"

God's love is so great that it must be shared and so the Spirit of God's truth comes to us to guide us and declare to us "the things that are to come". In this feast of the Most Holy Trinity, let us try to react to that great love which has been shown to us, by using it as a model of how we are to love other people. Because as Jesus concludes in the Gospel today, God will take what is mine and declare it to you. Let us act on it, never forget it, and make the world a better place because of it.

IN TODAYS GOSPEL

Pope Francis has said that the confessional shouldn't be a torture chamber and has recommended that a homily be brief, no more than ten minutes! For the Pope the homily is a sacred moment in the Mass. it is a way of "taking up anew that dialogue which has already been opened between the Lord and his people. The one who gives the homily has to remember he isn't doing something of his own. He's preaching, he's giving a



voice to Jesus, he's preaching the Word of Jesus. It has to be well prepared and brief, brief." Many clergy confess that of all the Sundays in the year they find Trinity Sunday the most difficult to preach at, and consequently they relish the chance to arrange for someone else to take their place on this occasion. Isn't this a shame? The very opposite should be true: they should be guarding and protecting this day as there could be no greater privilege than to preach on the most wonderful mystery of all, the Holy and Blessed Trinity.

There is no way around the fact that the Christian faith has elements within it which are utterly offensive to adherents of the two other major faiths. This teaching of the Blessed Trinity, revealed in the incarnation of the Son of God, is one of them. The notion that God would enter human time and space and would allow himself to be humiliated by being put to death by crucifixion is unthinkable to Judaism and Islam. Jews and Muslims are united in their shared conviction that God is One, yes, but definitely not Three in One.

The greatest mystery of Christian truth is that in the Godhead there are three Persons, God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit. Faith allows us to accept this revelation; faith allows us to rejoice in it and enter into it. A famous icon by Rublev depicts the Trinity as three angels around a table with a space reserved for another guest. We are that guest, because by the grace of baptism we are invited to enjoy and immerse ourselves in the mystery and glory of the triune life of God.

"O eternal trinity, God, you are an abyss, a deep sea; you have given yourself to me - what greater good amid you give? By your light you enlighten our minds, as by your light you have brought me to know you." (St. Gather, ne of Siena)

Feast Days

ST. ALOYSIUS GONZAGA.

A son of Ferrante, marchese di Castiglione, Aloysius was educated at the ducal courts of Florence and Mantua and at the royal court of Madrid, where he was page to King Philip II's son Diego. In 1585 he resigned his inheritance and entered the Jesuits at Rome, where one of his spiritual directors was the renowned theologian Robert Bellarmine. Shortly before ordination, while nursing victims of the plague, he contracted the disease and died. He was named patron of youth by Pope Benedict XIII in 1729, an action confirmed by Pope Pius XI in 1926.
