SYNODAL Pathway Progress

We invite you to reflect on the Synodal Pathway. Pope Francis has extended Synod on Synodality to 2024. He made this decision "in order to have a more relaxed period of discernment". He would like everyone to live it as the journey of brothers and sisters who proclaim the joy of the Gospel. The first was the worldwide undertaking during which Catholics were encouraged to submit feedback to their local dioceses - these have now gone to Rome. The continental share discussion will be with the Synod of Bishops. The final universal phase will begin at the General Assembly of Synod of Bishops October 2023 to October 2024.

In the meantime, we need to reflect on Eucharistic revival and how we develop and some of reverence and awe in our celebration of the Eucharist and live our Catholic values in today's world.

IN TODAY'S GOSPEL

The word 'Advent' comes from the Latin 'adventus', meaning 'arrival', which in itself finds its root in another Latin word 'advenire' - 'ad' meaning 'to' and "venire' meaning 'come'. Advent therefore invites us to ponder the first Coming of Christ and also look forward to his Second. The Advent liturgy makes present this ancient expectancy of the Coming of the Messiah, as well as encouraging us to renew our ardent desire for Christ's Second Coming.

We don't tend to think about - let alone pray and long for - the return of Jesus. This central pillar of Christian revelation seems to have been ignored in past years and is little understood, preached or talked about. When did you last hear a sermon on the Second Coming of Christ? Regardless, every time we recite the Creed we proclaim our belief in this great truth of our faith: 'I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ...He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end.' Indeed, the Catechism of the Catholic Church is clear about Jesus' return being imminent: 'Since the Ascension Christ's coming in glory has been imminent... .This eschatological coming could be accomplished at any moment, even if both it and the final trial that will precede it are "delayed" (para. 673).

If you look up the word 'imminent' in the dictionary, the definition is shown as 'about to happen'. In truth, most of us probably don't actually believe that the Second Coming is imminent, and we probably resist it because it doesn't have an impact on our daily lives. However, when we touch upon something of the significance of Jesus' First Coming, we will find ourselves groaning and longing for his Second.

The Holy Spirit enlightens us because the prayer of the Spirit is 'Come, Lord Jesus.' The Church, the Bride, also enlightens us because her blessed hope too is, 'Come. Lord Jesus, Come.' The beginning of Advent, then, is a time to renew this expectation that Jesus is going to return in glory as Lord and King.

'The one who testifies to these things says, "Surely I am coming soon." Amen. Come, Lord Jesus!' (Rev. 22:20)

Journey Home Threshold of Hope (Continued)

IN BRIEF: "PRAYER IS THE RAISING OF ONE'S HEART TO GOD OR THE REQUESTING OF GOOD THINGS FROM GOD."

Jesus teaches us how to pray.

When Jesus prays he is already teaching us how to pray. His prayer to his Father is the theological path (the path of faith, hope, and charity) of our prayer to God. But the Gospel also gives Jesus' explicit teaching on prayer. Like a wise teacher he takes hold of us where we are and leads us progressively toward the Father. Addressing the crowds following him, Jesus builds on what they already know of prayer from the Old Covenant and opens to them the newness of the coming Kingdom. Then he reveals this newness to them in parables. Finally, he will speak openly of the Father and the Holy Spirit to his disciples who will be the teachers of prayer in his Church. From the Sermon on the Mount onwards, lesus insists on conversion of heart: reconciliation with one's brother before presenting an offering on the altar, love of enemies, and prayer for persecutors, prayer to the Father in secret, not heaping up empty phrases, prayerful forgiveness from the depths of the heart, purity of heart, and seeking the Kingdom before all else. This filial conversion is entirely directed to the Father. Once committed to conversion, the heart learns to pray in faith. Faith is a filial

Once committed to conversion, the heart learns to pray in faith. Faith is a filial adherence to God beyond what we feel and understand. It is possible because the beloved Son gives us access to the Father. He can ask us to "seek" and to "knock," since he himself is the door and the way.


