IN TODAY'S GOSPEL

Ask any parent, or indeed grandparent, about the birth of a baby into the family and the resounding emotion is overwhelming joy. The nature of this joy can be hard to express but it is a profound emotion, touching us all and reaching the very core of our being.


We encounter this kind of joy today as Mary visits Elizabeth. What is remarkable is that Elizabeth's joy isn't focused on her own imminent delivery, but on the fruit of Mary's womb. Indeed, so wonderful and overwhelming is her joy that even her unborn baby leaps for joy.

How true and pertinent are the Lover's words in The Song of Songs: 'For lo, the winter is past, the rain is over and gone. The flowers appear on the earth; the time of singing has come, and the voice of the turtledove is heard in our land' (2:11-12).

What was at the heart of the joy of Mary, Elizabeth and indeed John the Baptist in the womb? We could call this the 'Joy of salvation'. This special, unique joy is the fruit of the Holy Spirit at work within the heart, giving it a sense of delight and wellbeing in God, his plans and his purposes. As St. Augustine observed 'There is a joy which is not given to the ungodly, but to those who love thee for thine own sake, whose joy thou thyself art.' Faith gives us joy and joy deepens our faith. Elizabeth shed light on this when she said of Mary: 'Blessed is she who believed that there would be a fulfilment of what was spoken to her from the Lord' (v. 45).

We too can know this joy as we move towards Christmas Day and the birth of our Saviour. In Jesus God accomplished everything he needed to rescue us from sin, Satan and death. The Father's joy in his Son is our joy too. As the great and holy day approaches, let us ensure we make some time to be still and receive the joy of Christ into our hearts.

Welcome to all our parish family and our visitors to our Sunday Mass.

The Eucharist is the 'source and summit of the Christian life'. Everything we are as Christians flows from the celebration of Mass and every thing we do finds its ultimate meaning and fulfilment in the Eucharist. It is important for us to reflect on the above and come early to prepare ourselves for our encounter with the Lord. If you come infrequently to Mass, please reflect on the command of the Lord to 'Do This in Memory of Me'. God loves you so much more than you realise and yet some of us

forget and put other things in place of Him. The Eucharist opens our hearts to God and unlocks our hearts to all those whom Jesus calls 'the least of my brothers and sisters'. The hungry and the thirsty, the strangers and the prisoners, the sick and those who have been stripped naked. The word Eucharist means Thanksgiving. All of us have so much to be thankful for in our lives that we can take for granted.

This week is the last before the celebration of the Birth of Our Saviour. Let's not forget to make our spiritual preparation by praying the rosary.

Also reflect on the story of the Annunciation in Luke's account in chapter 1 verses 26 to 28. In particular dwell on Mary listening to the angel Gabriel and Mary's care by visiting Elizabeth. Above all don't forget the Sacrament of Reconciliation receiving God's mercy and forgiveness for our waywardness. 'Lord by the power of your Spirit transform the way I think, and by my words and deeds may I witness to your love and mercy'.

Honouring Sunday

As the Synodal Pathway of listening and discerning unfolds, we the bishops of England and Wales, are paying particular attention to the hopes and fears, the joys and anxieties of all who are sharing their thoughts and feelings with us.

RESPONDING TO THE GIFT

We now encourage all Catholics to look again at the patterns which they have formed in recent months with regard to going to Mass on Sundays. This would include consideration and reflection about what we might do on Sundays, such as sports or shopping, or other leisure and social activities. This review, and the decisions which arise from it, fall to every Catholic, and we trust this will be done with honesty, motivated by a real love for the Lord whom we encounter in the Mass. The Sunday Mass is the very heartbeat of the Church and of our personal life of faith. We gather on the "first day of the week," and devote ourselves to the apostles' teaching and the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers (Acts 2:42). The Eucharist sustains us and spurs us on, renewing our gratitude and our hope. When we say "Amen" to Christ in receiving his Body and Blood, we express the love of God which is deep within us, and at the end of Mass, when we are sent forth, we express our love for our neighbour, especially those in need. These two dimensions reveal the full meaning of our faith. We are gathered together and sent out, we pray and are fed, we worship and we adore; these are intrinsic to our lives as those baptised into Christ.


